Nov. 19, 1999 – Considered by the Senate. (Congressional Record p. [S14902](#))

Nov. 19, 1999 – Measure passed in Senate by unanimous consent. (Text of bill, as passed in the Senate, appears on pg. [S14902](#) of the Nov. 19, 1999, Congressional Record.) (Congressional Record p. [S14902](#))

Feb. 8, 2000 – Referred to House Committee on Government Reform in addition to the House Committee on the Judiciary for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
