PROPOSED DECISION

This is a claim under Section 303(3) of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, against the Government of Hungary, by EUGENE AGOSTON, for the failure of the said government to meet its contractual obligations.

The record shows that in 1924 claimant contracted with the Fonciere Altalanos Biztosito Intezet, in Budapest, Hungary, for a twenty-year life insurance policy in the amount of \$1,000.00, which matured on August 5, 1944.

Information available to the Commission discloses that the Office of Alien Property, Department of Justice, by Payment Order No. 672, dated August 30, 1957, directed payment of the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to claimant in full satisfaction of his claim.

Accordingly, this claim is denied for the reason that it has been fully satisfied. The Commission finds it unnecessary to make determinations with respect to other elements of this claim.
