MAN SENTENCED ON CHILD PORNOGRAPHY CHARGES

RANDALL ANTHONY KRAMER, age 56, a former resident of Crosses, Arkansas, in Madison County, Arkansas, and also formerly of Oakhurst, California, was sentenced in United States District Court, Western District of Arkansas, today by Chief United States District Court Judge Jimm Larry Hendren, to serve 110 months imprisonment for possessing a computer that contained images of child pornography that Kramer had transported in interstate and foreign commerce, a violation of Title 18, United States code, Sections 2252(a)(4)(B) and (b)(2). Chief Judge Hendren also sentenced Kramer to lifetime supervised release after his release from prison, and ordered him to pay a \$10,000 fine and a \$100 special assessment.

In late December 2005, the defendant took a computer to the Crosses Grocery and Cafe in Crosses, Arkansas, to show the owner of the Crosses Cafe how to set up an internet cafe.

When it was turned on, images of child pornography were discovered. The Madison County Sheriff's Office was notified. Sheriff's deputies took the computer into evidence and turned it over to the FBI for examination.

The FBI found images depicting minors engaged in sexually explicit conduct, as that term is defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 2256, on the computer. One of those images was identified by the National Center for

Missing and Exploited Children ("NCMEC") as an image of an identifiable child who was under the age of 18 at the time the photograph was taken. The forensic examination revealed that images of minors engaged in sexually explicit conduct were on the computer's hard drive prior to December 2005 when Kramer had possession of the computer.

This case was investigation by officers of the Madison County Sheriff's Office, the FBI, the Fayetteville Police Department and the Madera County Sheriff's Office in California. The case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Kyra Jenner.
