PROJECT SAFE CHILDHOOD NETS INGALLS, INDIANA RESIDENT CHARGED WITH POSSESSING CHILD PORNOGRAPHY

PRESS RELEASE

Susan W. Brooks, United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that JASON BOSLER of Ingalls, Indiana, was charged today with possession of child pornography, following an investigation by Immigration and Customs Enforcement.

The information alleges that on or about December 7, 2006, BOSLER possessed approximately 3,465 computer files that contained child pornography images. Twenty-four files were specifically identified in the charging document.

According to Assistant United States Attorney Gayle L. Helart, who is prosecuting the case for the government, BOSLER faces a maximum possible prison sentence of 10 years and a maximum possible fine of \$250,000. An initial appearance will be scheduled before a magistrate judge.

This case is being brought as part of Project Safe Childhood. In February 2006, Attorney General Alberto R. Gonzales created Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative designed to protect children from online exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorneys Offices, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as identify and rescue victims.
