Seeking Peer Reviewers

The U.S. Department of Justice is recruiting Indian country professionals to serve as peer reviewers for Fiscal Year 2013. The Department is particularly interested in recruiting individuals from the following professions/disciplines:

- Law enforcement
- Prosecution
- Corrections
- Judges
- Tribal court administrators
- Victim advocates
- Juvenile justice professionals
- Child welfare professionals
- Attorneys
- Probation officers
- Mental health and substance abuse professionals
- Tribal youth and/or human service professionals

Individuals who are interested in being considered as a reviewer must be knowledgeable about tribal cultural beliefs, traditions, and practices, and must be able to demonstrate an expert level of understanding of at least one of the following issues:

- Tribal court development and administration;
- Community policing;
- Elder abuse;

- Renovation and construction of tribal correctional and correctional alternative facilities;
- Youth development programs, including those with an emphasis on reconnecting youth to cultural practices Juvenile detention and reentry programming;
- Sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking;
- Child sexual abuse;
- Services for children exposed to violence, including specialists in trauma informed care;
- Civil legal assistance needs of victims of violence against women;
- Developing and operating safe homes, shelter programs, and transitional housing assistance programs for victims of violence against women;
- Coordinated community response or multi-disciplinary team development and facilitation; or
- Developing and administering drug and alcohol prevention programs.

Individuals interested in being considered as a reviewer must complete the “Working Effectively with Tribal Governments” online training course. Potential reviewers should fill out the requested information, and choose DOJ Peer Reviewer from the dropdown list.

The Department will review your credentials and will contact you if your expertise is needed for this year's peer review process. All reviewers will be compensated for their work, and will be expected to commit to participating in a review process that will take place both online as well as by phone.
