SECOND SUPERSEDING INDICTMENT

COUNT ONE

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

At all times relevant to this indictment:

1. Tourneau, a watch and jewelry store located at 160 North Gulph Road, King of Prussia, Pennsylvania, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce by providing to customers jewelry, watches, and other goods produced, purchased, and transported from other states and countries to Pennsylvania.
2. Govberg Jewelers, a watch and jewelry store located at 292 Montgomery Avenue in Ardmore, Pennsylvania, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce

by providing to customers jewelry, watches, and other goods produced, purchased, and transported from other states and countries to Pennsylvania.

3. Bernie Robbins Jewelry, a watch and jewelry store located at 595 E. Lancaster Avenue in Saint Davids, Pennsylvania, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce by providing to customers jewelry, watches, and other goods produced, purchased, and transported from other states and countries to Pennsylvania.

4. Jay Roberts Jewelers, a watch and jewelry store located at 515 Route 73 South in Marlton, New Jersey, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce by providing to customers jewelry, watches, and other goods produced, purchased, and transported from other states and countries to New Jersey.

5. Hamilton Jewelers, a watch and jewelry store located at 2542 Brunswick Pike in Lawrenceville, New Jersey, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce by providing to customers jewelry, watches, and other goods produced, purchased, and transported from other states and countries to New Jersey.

6. From on or about July 13, 2011, through on or about November 3, 2012, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, and elsewhere, defendants

conspired and agreed, together and with persons known to the grand jury, including, but not limited to, Willie Hawkins Smith, James Howard, and Santo Wadlington, charged elsewhere, and Robbers #1, and #3, and persons unknown to the grand jury, including Robber #2, to commit robbery, which robberies unlawfully obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce, and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, in that defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON, KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and DERRICK SHERRILL conspired to unlawfully take and obtain luxury wristwatches and other items of value from multiple businesses by entering the stores while they were open for business with hammers and firearms, and stealing wristwatches and jewelry that were kept in glass display cases by smashing the cases with hammers, in the presence of the business owners, their employees, and customers, and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future, to their person and property, all in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a), (b)(1), and (b)(3).

MANNER AND MEANS

7. It was part of the conspiracy defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY recruited and organized the smash-and-grab jewelry store robbery crews to steal by force and violence and the use of firearms and hammers, expensive watches and jewelry, and arranged for the proceeds to be fenced for cash to be shared by defendants WILLIAMS and STORY and the robbery crews.

8. It was a further part of the conspiracy that to carry out the robberies of the Tourneau store, Govberg Jewelers, Bernie Robbins Jewelers, Jay Roberts Jewelers and Hamilton

Jewelers, the retail watch and jewelry businesses listed in Paragraphs 1 through 5, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON, KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and DERRICK SHERRILL, and persons known and unknown to the grand jury:

a. researched the businesses over the Internet and entered the businesses beforehand to determine whether the businesses were selling high end and luxury wristwatches in sufficient quantities in glass display cases on the sales floors of the stores;

b. wore masks, bandannas, hats, hooded sweatshirts, and Islamic burqas and hijabs to conceal their faces and identities to elude law enforcement;

c. used large hammers and sledgehammers to smash the display cases containing high end and luxury wristwatches to remove the watches and jewelry from the cases and place them in bags that they were carrying with them;

d. used firearms, hammers, and sledgehammers to terrorize the owners and employees of the businesses to prevent them from interfering with the robbery and to enforce compliance with their demands;

e. stole over \$3,502,544 in wristwatches and jewelry through the commission of multiple armed robberies of the jewelry stores in paragraphs 1 through 5 above, and by placing the business owners and their employees in fear of physical harm; and

f. shared the proceeds of the robberies by either selling the watches and jewelry and dividing the proceeds from those sales, or splitting the stolen watches and jewelry among themselves.

OVERT ACTS

9. In furtherance of the conspiracy and to affect the object of the conspiracy, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON, KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and DERRICK SHERRILL, and persons known and unknown to the grand jury including, but not limited to, Willie Hawkins Smith, James Howard, and Santo Wadlington, charged elsewhere, and Robbers #1, #2, and #3, committed the following overt acts, among others, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania and elsewhere:

**The July 13, 2011 Tourneau Robbery
King of Prussia, Pennsylvania**

On or about July 13, 2011:

1. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Willie Hawkins Smith, and a person known to the grand jury, Robber #1, drove from Philadelphia to the parking lot of the King of Prussia Mall.

2. Willie Hawkins Smith got out of his car and went inside the King of Prussia Mall while defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Robber #1 waited outside. Smith went to the Tourneau watch and jewelry store and determined that there were no law enforcement personnel in the area.

3. Willie Hawkins Smith returned to defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Robber #1, who were waiting outside the mall in a car, and gave them the “ok” to commit the robbery.

4. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Robber #1, while armed with hammers, and a firearm, that is, a black handgun, entered the

Tourneau store through the front entrance, while Willie Hawkins Smith waited outside as a lookout and getaway driver.

5. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Robber #1, forced employees and bystanders to the floor of the Tourneau store at gunpoint while smashing the glass display cases holding men's and women's luxury watches, which they stole from the broken display cases before fleeing the store.

6. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY gave the stolen watches to a person known to the grand jury and defendant RUFUS LAWSON, who sold the watches, and gave a portion of the proceeds of the sales of the stolen items to defendants WILLIAMS and STORY, Smith, and Robber #1.

**The Govberg Jewelers Robbery
Ardmore, Pennsylvania**

On or about January 9, 2012:

7. Defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS drove to Govberg's Jewelers in Ardmore, Pennsylvania, from Philadelphia.

8. When they arrived, defendant KENNETH L. WILLIAMS entered the store and looked at the watches for sale.

9. Defendant KENNETH L. WILLIAMS returned to where defendant LAWSON was waiting and told defendant LAWSON that the store had no Rolex brand watches, but that they did have many Breitling brand and other "nice" watches in the store.

10. Defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS returned to Philadelphia, where defendants LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS reported this

information to defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY.

11. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON, KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, Robber #1, and Robber #2, met in Philadelphia.

12. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON, KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, Robber #1, and Robber #2, drove from Philadelphia to the back parking lot of Govberg Jewelers.

13. Robber #2 walked up to the front of Govberg's Jewelers, rang the buzzer, and a store employee unlocked the door.

14. When Robber #2 opened the door, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #1, entered the store through the front door.

15. Defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS initially remained in defendant KENNETH L. WILLIAMS's truck behind the Govberg's store in the parking lot, acting as backup getaway drivers and lookouts.

16. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #1, intimidated and threatened employees and customers of the Govberg's Jewelry with hammers while smashing the glass display cases containing luxury wristwatches.

17. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #1 took

approximately \$437,804 in watches and jewelry from the broken display cases before fleeing the store and returning to Philadelphia.

18. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY gave the stolen watches and jewelry to defendant RUFUS LAWSON, who sold the watches and turned over the proceeds of the sales in the form of U.S. currency to defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and STORY, who kept part of the proceeds for themselves.

19. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY distributed the remainder of the of the proceeds to defendants RUFUS LAWSON, ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, Robber #1, and Robber #2.

**The Bernie Robbins Jewelers Robbery
Saint Davids, Pennsylvania**

On or about February 22, 2012:

20. Defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and Robber #3, drove from Philadelphia to Bernie Robbins Jewelers.

21. When they arrived, Robber #3 entered the store and looked at the watches for sale.

22. Robber #3 returned to where defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS were waiting and told them that the store had Rolex and Cartier brand watches.

23. Defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and Robber #3 returned to Philadelphia, where defendants LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS

reported this information to defendant DARRELL WILLIAMS.

24. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and RUFUS LAWSON, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #2 met in Philadelphia, and drove in multiple automobiles from Philadelphia to a parking lot near Bernie Robbins Jewelers.

25. Robber #2 walked up to the front of Bernie Robbins Jewelers, rang the buzzer, and a store employee approached and opened the door.

26. As the employee opened the door, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith, entered the store through the front door.

27. Defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS remained in the nearby parking lot, acting as lookouts and backup getaway drivers.

28. Once inside the store, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and RUFUS LAWSON, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, brandished handguns and forced employees and bystanders to the floor of the store at gunpoint while smashing the glass display cases containing luxury wristwatches, and took approximately \$499,655 of watches from the broken display cases before fleeing the store and returning to Philadelphia.

29. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY gave the stolen watches to defendant RUFUS LAWSON, who sold the watches and turned over the proceeds of the sales in the form of U.S. currency to defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and STORY, who kept part of the proceeds for themselves.

30. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY gave the remainder of the proceeds to defendants RUFUS LAWSON, and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #2.

**The Jay Roberts Jewelers Robbery
Marlton, New Jersey**

On or about March 8, 2012:

31. Defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and Robber #3, drove to Jay Roberts Jewelers in Marlton, New Jersey, from Philadelphia.

32. When they arrived, Robber #3 entered the store and looked at the watches for sale. Robber #3 returned to where defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS were waiting and told them that the store had Breitling brand watches. Defendants LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and Robber #3 returned to Philadelphia, where defendant LAWSON reported this information to defendant DARRELL WILLIAMS.

33. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY met Willie Hawkins Smith in Philadelphia, and drove from there to the back parking lot of Jay Roberts Jewelers.

34. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Willie Hawkins Smith, got out of their car and entered the store through the front door of Jay Roberts Jewelers yelling at employees and customers to “get down.”

35. Defendant DAVID STORY began smashing with a hammer the glass cases where the watches were displayed while defendant DARRELL WILLIAMS and Willie Hawkins

Smith took 83 watches worth approximately \$450,845 and placed them in a bag that they were carrying, before fleeing the store.

36. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Willie Hawkins Smith, drove directly back to Philadelphia, where they gave the watches to defendant RUFUS LAWSON, who sold them in exchange for U.S. currency.

37. Defendant RUFUS LAWSON gave the U.S. currency to defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, who kept part of the cash for themselves, and distributed the remainder to defendant LAWSON, and Willie Hawkins Smith.

**The April 13, 2012 Tourneau Robbery
King of Prussia, Pennsylvania**

On or about April 13, 2012:

38. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS DAVID STORY, and RUFUS LAWSON and James Lee Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith, drove from Philadelphia to the parking lot of the King of Prussia Mall.

39. Defendant RUFUS LAWSON got out of his car and went inside the King of Prussia Mall while defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and James Lee Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith waited outside.

40. Defendant RUFUS LAWSON went to a coffee shop across from the Tourneau store, where he called Santo Wadlington and told him that there were no law enforcement personnel in the area.

41. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and James Lee Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith, while armed with hammers

and firearms, that is two black handguns, entered the Tourneau store through the front entrance.

42. James Lee Howard and Santo Wadlington brandished firearms, while they subdued the store security guard by tying his hands and ankles with plastic zip ties.

43. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and DAVID STORY, and Willie Hawkins Smith smashed the glass display cases holding luxury wristwatches, taking 28 Rolex brand watches, worth approximately \$685,250, from the broken display cases and placing them into bags that they were carrying, before fleeing the store.

44. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and RUFUS LAWSON, and James Lee Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith returned to Philadelphia, where they divided the watches among them.

**The Hamilton Jewelers Robbery
Lawrenceville, New Jersey**

On or about August 1, 2012:

45. Defendant KENNETH L. WILLIAMS and Robber #3, went to Hamilton Jewelers in Lawrenceville, New Jersey from Philadelphia.

46. Defendant KENNETH L. WILLIAMS and Robber #3 entered the store and saw that the store offered luxury wristwatches for retail sale that were displayed in glass cases. Defendant KENNETH L. WILLIAMS and Robber #3 returned to Philadelphia and reported this information to defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY and RUFUS LAWSON.

47. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON and DERRICK SHERRILL met in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and drove from there to the parking lot in front of Hamilton Jewelers in Lawrenceville, New Jersey.

48. Defendant RUFUS LAWSON remained in the parking lot acting as a lookout and getaway driver.

49. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, and DERRICK SHERRILL entered Hamilton Jewelers carrying hammers and bags.

50. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY and DERRICK SHERRILL smashed the glass cases containing wristwatches and took 46 watches worth approximately \$373,035, before fleeing the store.

51. Defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON and DERRICK SHERRILL took the watches to Philadelphia, where they divided the watches among them.

**The August 22, 2012 Tourneau Robbery
King of Prussia, Pennsylvania**

On or about August 22, 2012:

52. Defendant DAVID STORY and Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #1 met in Philadelphia and drove from there to the parking lot of the King of Prussia Mall.

53. Defendant DAVID STORY, Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #1, while armed with a hammer, entered the Tourneau store through the front entrance.

54. Defendant DAVID STORY charged at an employee of the Tourneau store with a hammer.

55. Defendant DAVID STORY, Willie Hawkins Smith, and Robber #1, smashed the glass display cases containing luxury wristwatches, which they took from the broken display cases and placed in bags that they were carrying, before fleeing the store and returning to

Philadelphia.

56. Defendant DAVID STORY distributed the stolen wristwatches to defendants RUFUS LAWSON and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, who attempted to sell the watches in Philadelphia.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a).

COUNT TWO

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

1. Paragraphs 1 and 7 through 9, and Overt Acts 1 through 6 of Count One of this second superseding indictment are incorporated here.

2. On or about July 13, 2011, in King of Prussia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

a/k/a, "Darrell Blue," and
DAVID STORY,
a/k/a "Dawoo,"**

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS and STORY, and Willie Hawkins Smith, charged elsewhere, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is jewelry and wristwatches valued at approximately \$576,700, and other items, from Tourneau located at 160 North Gulph Road, in King of Prussia, in the presence of employees of Tourneau and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Tourneau, by brandishing and using a firearm to threaten and control the victims to steal watches, and other things of value from them, and by brandishing and swinging hammers, destroying property, and otherwise threatening them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

COUNT THREE

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

1. Paragraphs 1 and 7 through 9, and Overt Acts 1 through 6 of Count One of this second superseding indictment are incorporated here.

2. On or about July 13, 2011, in King of Prussia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

**DARRELL WILLIAMS,
a/k/a, "Darrell Blue," and
DAVID STORY
a/k/a "Dawoo,"**

and confederates knowingly used and carried, and aided and abetted the use and carrying of, a firearm during and in relation to a crime of violence for which they may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interferes with interstate commerce, as charged in Count Two of this indictment, and brandished, and aided and abetted the brandishing of, that firearm.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(c)(1) and 2.

COUNT FOUR

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

1. Paragraphs 2 and 7 through 9, and Overt Acts 7 through 19 of Count One of this second superseding indictment are incorporated here.

2. On or about January 9, 2012, in Ardmore, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

a/k/a "Ru,"
ANTHONY LOCKWOOD,

a/k/a "Ice,"**

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, STORY, LAWSON, LOCKWOOD, and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith, charged elsewhere, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is jewelry and wristwatches valued at approximately \$437,804, and other items, from Govberg Jewelers located at 595 E. Lancaster Avenue, in Ardmore, in the presence of employees of Govberg Jewelers and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Govberg Jewelers, by brandishing and using a firearm to threaten and

control the victims to steal jewelry, watches, and other things of value from them, and by brandishing and swinging hammers, destroying property, and otherwise threatening them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

COUNT FIVE

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

1. Paragraphs 3 and 7 through 9, and Overt Acts 20 through 30 of Count One of this second superseding indictment are incorporated here.

2. On or about February 22, 2012, in Saint Davids, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

DAVID STORY,
a/k/a "Dawoo,"
RUFUS LAWSON,
a/k/a "Ru," and
KENNETH L. WILLIAMS,
a/k/a "Ice,"**

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, DAVID STORY, RUFUS LAWSON, and KENNETH L. WILLIAMS, and James Howard, Santo Wadlington, and Willie Hawkins Smith, charged elsewhere, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is jewelry and wristwatches valued at approximately \$499,655, and other items, from Bernie Robbins Jewelers located at 595 E. Lancaster Avenue, in Saint Davids, in the presence of employees of Bernie Robbins Jewelers and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Bernie Robbins Jewelers, by brandishing and using a firearm to threaten and control the victims to steal jewelry, watches, and other things of value from

them, and by brandishing and swinging hammers, destroying property, and otherwise threatening them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

COUNT SIX

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

2. On or about February 22, 2012, in Saint Davids, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

and confederates knowingly used and carried, and aided and abetted the use and carrying of, a firearm during and in relation to a crime of violence for which they may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interferes with interstate commerce, as charged in Count Five of this indictment, and brandished, and aided and abetted the brandishing of, that firearm.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(c)(1) and 2.

COUNT SEVEN

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

1. Paragraphs 1 and 7 through 9, and Overt Acts 38 through 44 of Count One of this second superseding indictment are incorporated here.

2. On or about April 13, 2012, in King of Prussia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

**DARRELL WILLIAMS,
a/k/a, "Darrell Blue,"
DAVID STORY,
a/k/a "Dawoo," and
RUFUS LAWSON,
a/k/a "Ru,"**

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that, defendants DARRELL WILLIAMS, STORY, LAWSON, and Willie Hawkins Smith, James Howard, and Santo Wadlington, charged elsewhere, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is jewelry and wristwatches valued at approximately \$688,250, and other items, from Tourneau located at 160 North Gulph Road, in King of Prussia, in the presence of employees of Tourneau and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Tourneau, by brandishing and using a firearm to threaten and control the victims to steal watches, and other things of value from them, and by brandishing and swinging hammers, destroying property, and otherwise threatening them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

COUNT EIGHT

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

1. Paragraphs 1 and 7 through 9, and Overt Acts 38 through 44 of Count One of this second superseding indictment are incorporated here.

2. On or about April 13, 2012, in King of Prussia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

**DARRELL WILLIAMS,
a/k/a, "Darrell Blue,"
DAVID STORY,
a/k/a "Dawoo," and
RUFUS LAWSON,
a/k/a "Ru,"**

and confederates knowingly used and carried, and aided and abetted the use and carrying of, a firearm during and in relation to a crime of violence for which they may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interferes with interstate commerce, as charged in Count Seven of this indictment, and brandished and aided and abetted the brandishing of, that firearm.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(c)(1) and 2.

COUNT NINE

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

1. Paragraphs 1 and 7 through 9, and Overt Acts 52 through 56 of Count One of this second superseding indictment are incorporated here.

2. On or about August 22, 2012, in King of Prussia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

**DAVID STORY,
a/k/a "Dawoo,"**

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that, defendant STORY, and Willie Hawkins Smith, charged elsewhere, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is jewelry and wristwatches valued at approximately \$477,100, from Tourneau located at 160 North Gulph Road, in King of Prussia, in the presence of employees of Tourneau and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Tourneau, by brandishing and using a hammer to threaten and control the victims to steal watches, and other things of value from them, destroying property, and otherwise threatening them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

COUNT TEN

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

1. The Ultra Diamonds jewelry store, located at 18 West Lightcap Road in Pottstown, Pennsylvania, one of an interstate chain of jewelry stores headquartered in Chicago, Illinois, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce by providing to customers jewelry, watches, and other goods produced, purchased, and transported from other states to Pennsylvania.

2. On or about November 3, 2012, in Pottstown, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

**BRIAN MARQUISE SHEED and
AMIN ABDUR-RAHE SHABAZZ**

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that defendants SHEED and SHABAZZ, and Willie Hawkins Smith, charged elsewhere, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is approximately 12 wristwatches valued at \$64,809, and other items, from the Ultra Diamonds jewelry store located at 18 West Lightcap Road, in Pottstown, in the presence of employees of the Ultra Diamonds jewelry store and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and

future to the employees of Ultra Diamonds, by brandishing and swinging a sledgehammer and another hammer, destroying property, and otherwise threatening them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.
