INDICTMENT

COUNT ONE

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

On or about January 17, 2014, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

WILLIAM BUTLER

knowingly and unlawfully, by force and violence, and by intimidation, took from employees of Republic Bank, 1818 Market Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, lawful currency of the United States, that is, approximately \$3,250, belonging to, and in the care, custody, control, management and possession of Republic Bank, the deposits of which were and are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and, in so doing, defendant WILLIAM BUTLER knowingly and unlawfully assaulted and put in jeopardy the lives of the employees of Republic Bank, and other persons, by use of a dangerous weapon, that is, a knife.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(d).

COUNT TWO

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

On or about January 24, 2014, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

WILLIAM BUTLER

knowingly and unlawfully, by force and violence, and by intimidation, took from employees of Citizens Bank, 1701 John F. Kennedy Boulevard, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, lawful currency of the United States, that is, approximately \$1,020, belonging to, and in the care, custody, control, management and possession of Citizens Bank, the deposits of which were and are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and, in so doing, defendant WILLIAM BUTLER knowingly and unlawfully assaulted and put in jeopardy the lives of the employees of Citizens Bank, and other persons, by use of a dangerous weapon, that is, a knife.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(d).

COUNT THREE

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

On or about January 27, 2014, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

WILLIAM BUTLER

knowingly and unlawfully, by force and violence, and by intimidation, took from employees of Republic Bank, 1818 Market Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, lawful currency of the United States, that is, approximately \$1,410, belonging to, and in the care, custody, control, management and possession of Republic Bank, the deposits of which were and are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and, in so doing, defendant WILLIAM BUTLER knowingly and unlawfully assaulted and put in jeopardy the lives of the employees of Republic Bank, and other persons, by use of a dangerous weapon, that is, a knife.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(d).

COUNT FOUR

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

On or about January 28, 2014, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

WILLIAM BUTLER

knowingly and unlawfully, by force and violence, and by intimidation, took from employees of Citizens Bank, 1701 John F. Kennedy Boulevard, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, lawful currency of the United States, that is, approximately \$5,890, belonging to, and in the care, custody, control, management and possession of Citizens Bank, the deposits of which were and are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and, in so doing, defendant WILLIAM BUTLER knowingly and unlawfully assaulted and put in jeopardy the lives of the employees of Citizens Bank, and other persons, by use of a dangerous weapon, that is, a knife.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(d).
