INFORMATION

COUNT ONE

THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY CHARGES THAT:

On or about January 10, 2013, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, and elsewhere, defendant

MICHAEL GHABRIAL,

an officer of Valley National Bank, a financial institution, corruptly solicited and demanded for the benefit of himself, and corruptly accepted and agreed to accept, approximately \$7,500 in United States currency, intending to be influenced and rewarded in connection with the business and transactions of Valley National Bank, in that defendant GHABRIAL offered and agreed to sell Valley National Bank's real estate property at a reduced price in exchange for the bribe.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 215(a)(2).

NOTICE OF FORFEITURE

THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

1. As a result of the violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 215(a)(2), set forth in this information, defendant

MICHAEL GHABRIAL

shall forfeit to the United States of America, any property, real or personal, that constitutes or is derived from proceeds traceable to the commission of such offenses, as charged in this information, including but not limited to \$7,500 in United States currency.


2. If any of the property subject to forfeiture, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- (a) cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- (b) has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third party;
- (c) has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court;
- (d) has been substantially diminished in value; or
- (e) has been commingled with other property which cannot be divided without difficulty;

it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 982(b), incorporating Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), to seek forfeiture of any other

property of the defendant up to the value of the property subject to forfeiture.

All pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 982(a)(2).
