
THE UNITED STATES GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

COUNT 1
(Bank Robbery)

On or about November 9, 2013, in the State and District of Minnesota, the defendant,

MAURICE DIXON,
a/k/a Maurice Evans,

did knowingly, by force, violence and intimidation, take from the presence and person of a victim teller approximately \$175 in United States currency belonging to and in the care, custody, control, management, and possession of the TCF Bank located on Lexington Parkway North, in St. Paul, Minnesota, the deposits of which were then insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(a).



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COUNT 2
(Bank Robbery)

On or about November 4, 2013, in the State and District of Minnesota, the defendant,

MAURICE DIXON,
a/k/a Maurice Evans,

did knowingly, by force, violence and intimidation, take from the presence and person of a victim teller approximately \$768 in United States currency belonging to and in the care, custody, control, management, and possession of the TCF Bank located on University Avenue, in St. Paul, Minnesota, the deposits of which were then insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(a).

COUNT 3
(Bank Robbery)

On or about November 3, 2013, in the State and District of Minnesota, the defendant,

MAURICE DIXON,
a/k/a Maurice Evans,

did knowingly, by force, violence and intimidation, take and attempt to take from the presence and person of a victim teller approximately \$2,025 in United States currency belonging to and in the care, custody, control, management, and possession of the TCF Bank located on 26th Avenue South, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, the deposits of which were then insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(a).

COUNT 4

(Interference with Commerce by Robbery – “Hobbs Act”)

On or about October 18, 2013, in the State and District of Minnesota, the defendant,

MAURICE DIXON,
a/k/a Maurice Evans,

did unlawfully obstruct, delay, and affect, and attempt to obstruct, delay, and affect commerce, as that term is defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951, and the movement of articles and commodities in such commerce by robbery, as that term is defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951, in that defendant did knowingly and unlawfully take and obtain personal property consisting of United States currency from the presence of an employee of Little Caesar’s store, against her will by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury to the employee’s person, that is, the defendant brandished a knife and demanded United States currency from the employee, said currency then being in the custody and control of the Little Caesar’s store, a business engaged in interstate commerce, all in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951.
