

ATTACHMENT A

Count One – Hobbs Act Robbery

On or about May 20, 2013, in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere defendant,

JAMAR DARBY

did knowingly and willfully obstruct, delay, and affect, and attempt to obstruct, delay, and affect commerce, and the movement of articles and commodities in such commerce, by robbery, and committed and threatened physical violence to persons and property in furtherance thereof.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a) and Section 2.

Count Two – Use of a Firearm in Furtherance of a Crime of Violence

On or about May 20, 2013, in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere defendant,

JAMAR DARBY

during and in relation to a crime of violence for which the defendant may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, specifically, the Hobbs Act robbery set forth in Count One, did knowingly use, carry, and in furtherance of such crime, possess a firearm, which was brandished

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(c)(1)(A)(ii) and Section 2.

ATTACHMENT B

I, Douglas Man, am a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI"). I am fully familiar with the facts set forth herein based on my own investigation, my conversations with other law enforcement officers, and my review of reports, documents, and items of evidence. Where statements of others are related herein, they are related in substance and part. Because this complaint is being submitted for a limited purpose, I have not set forth each and every fact that I know concerning this investigation. Where I assert that an event took place on a particular date, I am asserting that it took place on or about the date alleged.

1. The FBI is investigating a string of armed robberies that took place between in or around December 2012 and in or around May 2013 in Essex and Union counties in New Jersey. Based upon information obtained and reviewed in connection with the investigation, including video surveillance, cell phone toll records and cell site data, witness interviews, and other evidence, I am aware of the following facts.

2. Defendant JAMAR DARBY ("DARBY") participated in a number of the armed robberies that took place between in or around December 2012 and in or around May 2013. All of the robberies were armed robberies involving commercial establishments, including convenience stores, restaurants, and gas stations.

3. For example, on or about May 20, 2013, DARBY and two other males robbed a Subway restaurant located at 45 Bloomfield Avenue in Verona, New Jersey (the "Subway Robbery"). The restaurant's surveillance video captured the robbery. DARBY entered the restaurant brandishing a handgun. DARBY wore a dark New York Yankees baseball cap with white lettering, dark pants, black boots, and black gloves. DARBY's face was covered with a black mask. DARBY and one of the other robbers took an employee to the back of the restaurant and restrained her hands and feet with plastic zip ties. After restraining the employee, the robbers emptied the restaurant's cash register, taking approximately \$409.75 in cash. DARBY and the other robbers then fled.

4. Law enforcement obtained a warrant to search DARBY's residence in Newark, New Jersey (the "Residence"). On June 21, 2013, law enforcement searched the Residence. Among other things, law enforcement recovered the following items from the Residence: (i) a dark New York Yankees baseball cap with white lettering; (ii) a pair of dark pants; and (iii) a pair of black boots, all of which resemble the items worn by DARBY during the Subway Robbery.

5. On June 21, 2013, law enforcement also searched a vehicle known to be used by DARBY. Among other things, law enforcement recovered the following items from the vehicle: (i) a black face mask; and (ii) a pair of black gloves, both of which resemble the items worn by DARBY during the Subway Robbery.

6. Law enforcement also obtained records associated with DARBY's phone number, including historical cell site data and toll records. The historical cell site data corresponding with DARBY's toll records indicates that DARBY's phone was in the vicinity of Subway around the time of the Subway Robbery.

7. At all times material to this Complaint, Subway was a commercial establishment engaged in selling food, beverages, and other items that moved in, were transferred in, and affected interstate and foreign commerce.
