I N F O R M A T I O N

The defendant having waived in open court prosecution by Indictment, the United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey charges:

**COUNT ONE  
(Hobbs Act Robbery)**

1. At all times material to this Information, Golden Palace was a commercial establishment located at 260 Main Street in Orange, Essex County, New Jersey, engaged in the sale of jewelry and other merchandise, an industry that affects interstate commerce.

2. On or about August 6, 2012, in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, the defendant,

CHARLES MADISON,

did knowingly and willfully obstruct, delay, and affect, and attempt to obstruct, delay, and affect, commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in such commerce, by robbery, as that term is defined in Title 18, United States

Code, Section 1951(b)(1), in that the defendant did unlawfully take and obtain personal property consisting of United States currency and jewelry from the persons of and in the presence of employees of the Golden Palace, against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future, to their persons and property in their custody, and property in their custody and possession.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

**COUNT TWO**  
**(Felon in Possession of a Firearm)**

On or about August 6, 2012, in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, the defendant,

CHARLES MADISON,

having been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Essex County, did knowingly possess in and affecting commerce firearms, namely, a .357 Magnum caliber Sturm Ruger revolver, bearing serial number 159-69609, and a 9mm caliber semi-automatic Sturm Ruger pistol, bearing serial number 332-63213, with a large-capacity magazine.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 2.

FORFEITURE ALLEGATIONS

1. The statements contained in Count Two of this Information are incorporated by reference as though set forth in full herein for the purpose of alleging forfeitures pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d)(1) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c).

2. Upon conviction of the offense in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g), set forth in Count Two of this Information, defendant CHARLES MADISON shall forfeit to the United States any firearms and ammunition involved in or used in the commission of that offense, including:

- a. One .357 Magnum caliber Sturm Ruger revolver, bearing serial number 159-69609;
- b. Five (5) unfired .357 Magnum Caliber cartridges with "R-P" headstamps;
- c. One 9mm caliber Sturm Ruger semi-automatic pistol, bearing serial number 332-63213 and a large-capacity magazine; and
- d. Seventeen (17) unfired 9mm full metal jacket cartridges with "LY9x1993" headstamps.

All pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d)(1) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c).
