INFORMATION

The defendant having waived in open court prosecution by indictment, the United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey charges:

1. At all times relevant to this Information:
  - a. Defendant MARCUS TAYLOR was a police officer with the Richard Stockton College Police Department, in Galloway, New Jersey.
  - b. There was a witness who was cooperating with law enforcement officers (the "CW").
  - c. There was an undercover law enforcement officer employed as a Task Force Officer with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (the "UC").
  - d. Oxycodone was a narcotic analgesic and a Schedule II Controlled Substance. Oxycodone was commonly sold in a pill form either as the pill's single ingredient, or as a combination product formulated with other non-narcotic ingredients.

2. Between on or about November 9, 2012 and on or about January 23, 2013, defendant MARCUS TAYLOR sold oxycodone-based pills to the CW and the UC on five separate occasions in exchange for cash payments as follows:

3. Between on or about November 9, 2012 and on or about January 23, 2013, in Camden County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, defendant

MARCUS TAYLOR

did knowingly and intentionally distribute and possess with intent to distribute a mixture and substance containing a detectable amount of oxycodone, a Schedule II controlled substance.

In violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(C).

**FORFEITURE ALLEGATION**

The allegations contained in this Information are hereby realleged and incorporated by reference for the purpose of noticing forfeiture pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853.

The United States hereby gives notice to defendant Marcus Taylor that upon conviction of the offense alleged in this Information, the government will seek forfeiture in accordance with Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(a), which requires any person convicted of such offense to forfeit any property constituting, or derived from, proceeds obtained, directly or indirectly, as a result of such offense, and any property used, or intended to be used, in any manner or part, to commit, or to facilitate the commission of such offense.

If any of the above-described forfeitable property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- (a) cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- (b) has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third party;
- (c) has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the court;
- (d) has been substantially diminished in value; or
- (e) has been commingled with other property which

cannot be divided without difficulty;  
it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to Title 21,  
United States Code, Section 853(p), to seek forfeiture of any  
other property of defendant Marcus Taylor up to the value of the  
forfeitable property described in this forfeiture allegation.
