

ATTACHMENT A

Count One (Theft of a Motor Vehicle by Force, Violence and by Intimidation)

On or about January 25, 2011, in Union and Essex Counties, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, the defendants

DAVID JONES,
a/k/a "David Davis,"
a/k/a "Nut,"
MAURICE WILLIAMS,
a/k/a "Mo," and
JERMAINE MAY,
a/k/a "Jungle,"

with the intent to cause death and serious bodily harm, knowingly took a motor vehicle, namely a Silver 2003 Infiniti G35, that had been transported, shipped and received in interstate and foreign commerce from the person and presence of another, namely M.D. and J.M., by force and violence and by intimidation.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2119 and Section 2.

Count Two (Use of a Firearm in Furtherance of a Crime of Violence)

On or about January 25, 2011, in Union and Essex Counties, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, the defendants

DAVID JONES,
a/k/a "David Davis,"
a/k/a "Nut,"
MAURICE WILLIAMS,
a/k/a "Mo,"
JERMAINE MAY, and
a/k/a "Jungle,"

during and in relation to a crime of violence for which defendants may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, specifically the carjacking set forth in Count One, did knowingly and willfully use, carry, and, possess, in furtherance of such crime, a firearm, which was brandished.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(c)(1)(A)(ii) and Section 2.

Count Three (Felon in Possession of a Firearm)

On or about January 25, 2011, in Union and Essex Counties, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, the defendant

DAVID JONES,
a/k/a "David Davis,"
a/k/a "Nut,"

having been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year in a court in the State of New Jersey, knowingly possessed in and affecting commerce a firearm, namely one black Glock Model 27 .40 caliber pistol, bearing serial number CWP182US and eleven rounds of .40 caliber ammunition.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g)(1).

ATTACHMENT B

I, SEAN P. LYNCH, am a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I have knowledge of the following facts based upon both my investigation and discussions with other law enforcement personnel and others. Where statements of others are set forth herein, these statements are related in substance and in part. Where I assert that an event took place on a particular date, I am asserting that it took place on or about the date alleged.

1. At approximately 11:00 p.m. on the evening of January 25, 2011, M.D. and J.M. were standing near the intersection of Green and Britton Streets in Elizabeth, Union County, New Jersey, and next to M.D.'s silver, two-door 2004 Infiniti G-35 (the "Silver Infiniti"). At the time, the Silver Infiniti's engine was running with the key in the ignition, and the vehicle's doors were open. Shortly after 11:00 p.m., a White Jeep Cherokee with New Jersey license plate M20-AJY (the "White Cherokee"), and occupied by four individuals, later identified as the defendants DAVID JONES, a/k/a "David Davis," a/k/a "Nut," MAURICE WILLIAMS, a/k/a "Mo," JERMAINE MAY, a/k/a "Jungle," and a fourth individual (collectively the "Defendants"), approached M.D. and J.M. Three of the Defendants exited the White Cherokee, brandished guns at M.D. and J.M., and ordered them to get on the ground. Two of the Defendants entered the Silver Infiniti and drove off, and the other two Defendants followed them in the White Cherokee.

2. Shortly thereafter, M.D. called 911 to report that M.D. and J.M. had been carjacked at gun point, and provided descriptions of the Silver Infiniti and White Cherokee. This information was relayed to the Elizabeth Police Department. Elizabeth police officers separately observed both the Silver Infiniti and the White Cherokee traveling at high rates of speed on Route 1 and 9 North in Elizabeth going towards Newark. Elizabeth police officers began to pursue both vehicles. The White Cherokee continued from Route 1 & 9 North onto Route 21 North towards Newark and was lost sight of, while the Silver Infiniti traveled towards Interstate 78 East.

3. Elizabeth police officers followed the carjacked Silver Infiniti. As the Silver Infiniti traveled onto Interstate 78 East, it slowed down and defendants WILLIAMS and JONES bailed from the vehicle and began to flee on foot. Several Elizabeth police officers exited their vehicles to pursue WILLIAMS and JONES. During the pursuit, JONES pointed a firearm in the direction of the Elizabeth police officers, and two Elizabeth officers discharged their firearms in JONES's direction. At that point, WILLIAMS stopped, and surrendered to one of the pursuing officers.

4. Elizabeth police officers also apprehended JONES after a brief pursuit, during the course of which JONES discarded the firearm that he pointed at the Elizabeth police officers. Elizabeth police officers recovered a black Glock Model 27 .40 caliber pistol, bearing serial number CWP182US, from near the area where JONES pointed the firearm at the pursuing officers. During a search of JONES incident to his arrest, officers recovered 11 rounds of .40 caliber ammunition, and 29 small zip lock bags containing crack cocaine.

5. The White Cherokee was subsequently found abandoned on Route 21 North near the Broad Street exit in Newark, NJ.

6. On or about January 28, 2011, M.D. was interviewed by law enforcement, and identified WILLIAMS and MAY in separate photo arrays as two of the individuals who carjacked M.D. and J.M. at gun point in Elizabeth on the evening of January 25, 2011, and took her Silver Infiniti. M.D. further stated that WILLIAMS and MAY were each carrying a firearm, and each brandished a weapon at M.D. and J.M. during the course of the carjacking. In addition, M.D. stated that she was forced to the ground during the carjacking.

7. The firearm defendant JONES had in his possession is a firearm within the meaning 18 U.S.C. § 921(a)(3) and was manufactured in Smyrna, Georgia.

8. A review of JONES's criminal history records conducted after his arrest on January 25, 2011 revealed that prior to that date, JONES had been convicted of a felony offense punishable by a term of imprisonment greater than one year in a court in the State of New Jersey. Specifically, on September 5, 2008, JONES was convicted of the following in Essex County Superior Court: aggravated assault in the third degree, in violation of N.J.S.A. § 2C:12-1B; resisting arrest while operating a motor vehicle in the third degree, in violation of N.J.S.A. § 2C:29-2; and, distribution of CDS on school property in the third degree, in violation of N.J.S.A. § 2C:35-7. JONES was sentenced to concurrent four year terms of imprisonment on each of these charges.

9. M.D.'s Silver Infiniti was manufactured in Japan.
