

(c) Defendant JOHN ADAMS was the Business Manager of Local 594. As such, he was a fiduciary to Local 594 and its membership, pursuant to Title 29, United States Code, Section 501(a).

(d) Beginning in 2001, DAMICO Inc. became a signatory to the Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") with the New Jersey Construction Laborers District Councils, through the execution of the Short Form Agreement. From in or about January 2009, through at least October 2009, DAMICO, Inc. provided demolition services at the New York Times jobsite in Edison, New Jersey. DAMICO Inc. was expected to operate under terms and conditions of the existing CBA with the Local 594. However, DAMICO Inc. violated the existing CBA agreement, and defendant JOHN ADAMS violated his fiduciary duty to the Local 594 members by accepting between \$5,000 and \$10,000 in U.S. currency to permit DAMICO, Inc. to employ non-union workers at the above described New York Times Building jobsite. Local 594 members lost approximately 10,440 hours in work opportunity and wages and an equal number of hours in benefit contributions.

2. From in or about January 2009 through in or about October 2009, in Middlesex County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, the defendant,

JOHN ADAMS,

being an officer and employee of Local 594, a labor organization, unlawfully and willfully requested, demanded, received, and accepted, and agreed to

receive and accept the payment of and delivery of a thing of value, namely, United States currency in an amount exceeding \$1,000, as described in Paragraph 1 (d) of this Information, from an employer, namely DAMICO, Inc., and a person acting in the interest of an employer, whose employees were employed in an industry affecting commerce and whom Local 594 would represent, seek to represent, and would admit to membership.

In violation of Title 29, United States Code, Sections 186(a)(2), (b)(1) and (d)(2), and Title 18, United States Code, Section 2.
