**ALBUQUERQUE MAN RECEIVES 46 MONTH SENTENCE FOR
ILLEGAL POSSESSION OF FIREARM AND AMMUNITION**

ALBUQUERQUE – This afternoon, **Jarred S. Bowen**, 28, of Albuquerque, was sentenced to 46 months imprisonment for unlawfully possessing a firearm and ammunition announced U.S. Attorney Kenneth J. Gonzales. Bowen will be on supervised release for three years after he completes his prison sentence.

Bowen was arrested on a criminal complaint on April 19, 2011, and has been in federal custody since that time. On October 13, 2011, Bowen was charged in a one-count superseding indictment with being a felon in possession of a firearm and ammunition. According to the superseding indictment, Bowen unlawfully possessed a firearm, a Walther, model PPK, .380 caliber pistol loaded with four rounds of ammunition, on April 19, 2011. At the time of his arrest, Bowen was prohibited from possessing firearms and ammunition because he previously had been convicted of forgery, conspiracy to commit aggravated burglary, being a felon in possession of a firearm, and aggravated assault with a deadly weapon in the Seventh Judicial District Court of the State of New Mexico.

Bowen pled guilty to the superseding indictment on November 1, 2011.

The case was investigated by the U.S. Marshal's Service and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Lynn W.Y. Wang and Jeremy Pena.
