CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

I, the complainant in this case, state that the following is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

On or about the date(s) of December 20, 2010 in the county of Lea in the
 District of New Mexico, the defendant(s) violated:

Title 21 USC 841	Possess with Intent to Distribute Approximately Twenty Grams of Crack Cocaine

This criminal complaint is based on these facts:

On December 20, 2010 in Hobbs, Lea County, New Mexico Hobbs Police Officer Chad Wright was on routine patrol in a marked unit and observed in the 1000 block of East Gypsy Street Carlos GIBSON step from a vehicle in an alley. Officer Wright saw a plastic baggie fall from GIBSON's lap on to the ground as GIBSON exited the vehicle. Officer Wright observed GIBSON pick up the baggie and place it in his coat pocket and begin walking away from the officer. Officer Wright approached GIBSON and asked him to stop and GIBSON attempted to flee. Officer Wright grabbed GIBSON by the coat sleeve and the coat came off in Officer Wright's hand as GIBSON ran away. Officer Wright continued pursuit of GIBSON and took him into custody.




STATEMENT OF FACTS (cont.)

Once GIBSON was handcuffed and secured in Officer Wright's vehicle Officer Wright searched the coat and found four baggies of a substance which later field tested positive for cocaine and has been submitted to the New Mexico Forensic Laboratory in Hobbs, NM.

A State District Court search warrant was obtained for GIBSON's vehicle and the search yielded a gray tray with cocaine residue consistent with parceling larger amounts of cocaine into smaller quantities for distribution. AUSA Michael Nammar authorized Federal prosecution of GIBSON.
