AFFIDAVIT

I, the undersigned, being duly sworn, hereby depose and state as follows:

1. I am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and have been employed in that capacity for more than thirteen and one-half years. I am currently assigned to the Albuquerque Division and investigate major crimes and conduct other investigations including but not limited to violent crimes and bank robberies. The information set forth in this affidavit has been derived from my own investigation or communicated to me by other sworn law enforcement officers or from other reliable sources.

2. On March 22, 2010, at approximately 12:15 p.m., the Bank of Albuquerque, 4700 Montgomery Boulevard, Northeast, Albuquerque, New Mexico, was robbed by an individual who entered the bank and presented a demand note to the teller. Written on the note were words to the effect of, "Give your 100s, 50s, and 20s! Don't give me the dye-pack or push the alarm. And if you do, I have a gun and I will kill you! Keep on smiling or I will use my gun! If you send anyone after me, I know (who or where) you are and I will kill you!" The teller provided the robber with a sum of United Stated Federal Reserve Bank Notes. The robber was last seen by bank personnel, fleeing the bank on foot.

1 The Bank of Albuquerque is a federally insured financial institution, and did
2 sustain a large loss in United States Federal Reserve Bank Notes.

4 The aforementioned robbery was conducted by a man described as a White
5 male, approximately 5'5"-5'7", light complexion, medium to heavy build, goatee, and
6 approximately late 20s in years of age. The robber was further described as wearing a dark
7 brown hooded sweat-jacket, a dark baseball style cap, and small metal framed sunglasses.

10 3. Earlier in the day, there was a report of a possible bank casing at another
11 bank in the Albuquerque area and the subject fled after being questioned by a bank
12 employee. The bank employee believing that the individual may have been intent on
13 robbing the bank, observed the man run to a red compact car. The man entered the
14 passenger side of the car. The bank employee was able to see the license plate and record it.
15 The event was reported to the Albuquerque Police Department (APD) and a "Be On the
16 Look Out" (BOLO) was posted.

19 4. An APD officer in an unmarked unit heard the dispatched call announcing
20 the bank robbery. The officer remembered that earlier in the day, there was a report of a
21 possible bank casing and the subject fled after being questioned by a bank employee. The
22 officer recalled the BOLO when he observed a red compact vehicle pass his vehicle. The
23 officer followed the red compact car and discovered that the license plate was the same as
24 the BOLO. The officer initiated a car stop and observed a person in the passenger seat
25 similar to the description of the bank robber. The individual was asked to exit the vehicle
26 and the officer immediately noticed that the man had a large quantities of money stuffed
27 inside his sweat-pants.

3 5. A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) arrived at the
4 scene and compared the bank surveillance photos from the Bank of Albuquerque robbery
5 with the man detained and concluded that the two appeared to be the same. APD officers
6 also on the scene were asked for a professional opinion and all agreed that the man detained
7 did look very similar to the bank robber. The man also had made several voluntary
8 statement further leading investigators to believe he was responsible for the aforementioned
9 bank robbery.

11 6. The individual detained was Kidd Reid Arrington year of birth 1973, SSAN
12 XXX-XX-4176. The FBI Special Agent at the scene advised the writer of Arrington and the
13 writer recalled him immediately, as the writer was involved in arresting Arrington over ten
14 years ago for the crime of bank robbery for which he was subsequently convicted and sent to
15 federal prison.

18 7. Arrington was transported to the FBI-Albuquerque Field Office and read his
19 Miranda Advice of Rights. Arrington advised he understood his rights, waived his rights
20 and affirmed that decision by signing the document agreeing to speak to the FBI.

23 8. Arrington admitted robbing the Bank of Albuquerque, 4700 Montgomery
24 Boulevard, Northeast, Albuquerque, New Mexico, earlier in the day. Arrington provided
25 exact details of the robberies that were only available to law enforcement and the individual
26 who robbed the bank.

Based on the information set forth in this affidavit, your affiant submits that there is probable cause to believe that Kidd Reid Arrington, year of birth 1973, SSAN XXX-XX-4176, did by intimidation and force, take money from the persons and presence of the Bank of Albuquerque, 4700 Montgomery Boulevard, Northeast, Albuquerque, New Mexico, on March 22, 2010, a federally insured financial institution.

Your affiant further submits that these robberies was committed in violation of Title 18 United States Code, Section 2113(a).
