**KEOKUK MAN**  
**SENTENCED FOR POSSESSION OF PSEUDOEPHEDRINE**  
**WITH INTENT TO MANUFACTURE METHAMPHETAMINE**

DAVENPORT, IA – Today, Scott Lane Staley, of Keokuk, Iowa, age 32, was sentenced by United States District Judge John A. Jarvey to 110 months of imprisonment, in connection with Staley's previous guilty plea to Possession of Pseudoephedrine with Intent to Manufacture Methamphetamine. Judge Jarvey also ordered Staley to serve 3 years of supervised release following his imprisonment and pay \$100 to the Crime Victims Fund.

For the past several years, Staley has been the subject of an on-going investigation regarding the manufacture of methamphetamine in the Keokuk area. On April 25, 2009, he was found in a room at the Travel Lodge Inn in possession of methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia, and precursor materials used in the manufacturing of methamphetamine, including 50 pseudoephedrine pills. Law enforcement determined that Staley intended to manufacture methamphetamine with these items.

This case was investigated by the Lee County Narcotics Task Force and the Iowa Division of Narcotics Enforcement and prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office, Southern District of Iowa.
