Man Sentenced to More Than 6 Years in Prison for Third Illegal Reentry and Failure to Register as a Sex Offender

DAVENPORT, IA – On January 4, 2013, Osvaldo Montes Olarte, age 36, was sentenced to 77 months of imprisonment for illegally reentering the United States and for failing to register as a sex offender, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. United States District Judge John A. Jarvey also sentenced Olarte to three years of supervised release for the immigration offense and seven years of supervised release for his failure to register as a sex offender.

Olarte illegally entered the United States in 1995. Olarte was convicted of Sexual Abuse in the Third Degree in Iowa in 2001 and he was deported in 2003 after his incarceration. As a result of his sexual abuse conviction Olarte was required to register as a sex offender. Olarte reentered the United States and was deported again in both 2006 and 2010. Olarte thereafter illegally reentered the United States for the third time and returned to Iowa. Olarte knowingly failed to register as a sex offender upon his return to Iowa.

This case was investigated by the United States Marshals Service, and was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
