BRANDON MAN SENTENCED FOR POSSESSION OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY

Brandon, Miss - Charles Sherrill Lloyd, 67, of Brandon, was sentenced in U.S. District Court today to serve 120 months in federal prison followed by a lifetime of supervised release for possession of child pornography, announced U.S. Attorney John Dowdy and Raymond R. Parmer, Jr. Special Agent in Charge of Immigration and Customs Enforcement, Homeland Security Investigations (ICE HSI).

According to court documents, in 2007, Lloyd possessed two different computers and several disks containing over 4,000 images of child pornography. He possessed images of child pornography at his place of business, in his vehicle and at his home. He also received computer files containing child pornography from an Internet website.

“The sexual exploitation of children is reprehensible criminal conduct that we have no intention of permitting in this district. We will continue to devote substantial resources to working together with our state and local partners to investigate and prosecute those crimes,” said U.S. Attorney Dowdy.

“Too many children are victimized by predators that target the most vulnerable among us - our children,” said Raymond R. Parmer Jr., special agent-in-charge of ICE HSI in New Orleans. “HSI is committed to apprehending and presenting for prosecution cases involving those who abuse our children and endanger their lives and well-being. We will continue working with federal, state and local agencies to ensure that those who try to hurt children are brought to justice.” Parmer oversees responsibility for the states of Mississippi, Arkansas, Tennessee, Alabama and Louisiana.

This case was investigated by ICE HSI and the United States Postal Inspection Service and prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Glenda R. Haynes.
