**BREAUX BRIDGE, LOUISIANA WOMAN PLEADS GUILTY  
IN FEDERAL COURT TO DRUG CHARGES**

**Lafayette, La.:** United States Attorney Stephanie A. Finley announced that Yvette Francis Eaglin, 42, of Breaux Bridge, La., pleaded guilty to drug charges today in federal court before U.S. District Judge Rebecca F. Doherty in Lafayette, La.

Eaglin was charged in a one count bill of information for conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute marijuana. According to court documents filed today, Eaglin admitted that from approximately January 1, 2005 and continuing until on or about June 20, 2005, she conspired with Eric Alexander, Bryan Malbreaux and others to possess with the intent to distribute 50 kilograms or more of a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of marijuana, a Schedule I controlled substance.

At sentencing, Eaglin faces a term of imprisonment of not more than 20 years, a fine of \$1,000,000.00, or both, and a term of supervised release of not less than three years. **Sentencing will be scheduled at a later date.**

The case was investigated by Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) and is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Daniel J. McCoy.
