**THREE MEN INDICTED FOR UNAUTHORIZED
ACCESS DEVICE CHARGES**

LAFAYETTE, LA: United States Attorney Stephanie A. Finley announced today that Shanji Jin, 38, of Chicago, IL, Hong Xi, 63, of Flushing, NY, and Yuan Chunshan, aka, Guang Li, 43, of Albuquerque, NM, were indicted by a federal grand jury on December 11, 2012, in a four-count indictment for Conspiracy to Use Counterfeit or Unauthorized Access Devices, and the actual Use of One or More Unauthorized Access Devices.

The indictment alleges that Jin, Xi and Chunshan conspired to engage in the use of one or more unauthorized access devices with the intent to defraud. Between November 20, 2012 and November 24, 2012, at or near Kinder, La., each defendant used one or more unauthorized access devices.

If convicted, the defendants face up to 10 years in prison for Conspiracy to Use Counterfeit or Unauthorized Access Devices and up to 10 years in prison for the Use of One or More Unauthorized Access Devices. Each defendant is also subject to a \$250,000 fine on each count.

An indictment is merely an accusation and a defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

This case is being investigated by the United States Secret Service, Baton Rouge Agency, and the Louisiana State Police and is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Howard C. Parker.
