FY 2013 Grant Program Solicitations

National Institute of Justice (NIJ)

Solicitation Title: NIJ, Exploratory Research on the Impact of the Growing Oil Industry in the Dakotas and Montana on Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking

Who Can Apply? Applicants are limited to states (including territories), units of local government (including Federally recognized Indian tribal governments as determined by the Secretary of the Interior), non-profit and for-profit organizations (including tribal non-profit and for-profit organizations), institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education), and certain qualified individuals. Consistent with OJP fiscal requirements, for-profit organizations are not permitted to make a profit as a result of this award or charge a management fee for the performance of this award. Foreign governments, foreign organizations, and foreign institutions of higher education are not eligible to apply.

What's It For? NIJ will award funding to support exploratory, mixed-methods research, employing both quantitative and qualitative data collection, related to the impact (if any) of the oil industry on domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking in the Dakotas and Montana. Applicants should propose to use a mixed-method approach to gather descriptive data from administrative records and interviews with federal, state, tribal, and local government agencies; service providers (e.g., victim and medical); and individuals. Qualitative and quantitative methods should be used to better understand whether the influx of oil workers in these communities is having any impact on victims of, or contributing to an increase in domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

When's It Due? Applications are due August 5, 2013.

Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP)

Solicitation Title: OJJDP, FY 2013 National Mentoring Resource Center

Who Can Apply? Applicants are limited to non-profit and for-profit organizations (including tribal non-profit and for-profit organizations) and institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education). Consistent with OJP fiscal requirements, for-profit organizations are not permitted to make a profit as a result of this award or charge a management fee for the performance of this award.

What's It For? OJJDP will award funding to support the development of the OJJDP National Mentoring Resource Center (NMRC), which will provide comprehensive mentoring resource, reference, and training materials and advance the implementation of evidence- and research-based mentoring practices. NMRC's goal is to enhance the capacity of mentoring organizations to develop, implement, and expand effective, quality mentoring practices.

When's It Due? Applications are due July 23, 2013.

Solicitation Title: OJJDP, FY 2013 Emergency Planning Demonstration Program

Who Can Apply? Applicants are limited to state agencies that the chief executive (i.e., the governor) has designated to receive Title II Formula Grant funds from OJJDP.

What's It For? OJJDP will provide resources for state agencies to develop comprehensive plans that address the specific needs of children, youth, and families who are involved in the justice system during an emergency. This demonstration effort will support emergency planning among state, local, and tribal juvenile justice residential facilities.

When's It Due? Applications are due July 25, 2013.

Solicitation Title: OJJDP, FY 2013 Youth with Sexual Behavior Problems Program

Who Can Apply? For Category 1, applicants are limited to states and units of local government (including Federally recognized tribal governments as determined by the Secretary of the Interior); non-profit and for-profit organizations, including tribal non-profit and for-profit organizations; and public institutions of higher education, including tribal institutions of higher education. For Category 2, applicants are limited to public institutions of higher education and non-profit and for-profit organizations. Consistent with OJP fiscal requirements, for-profit organizations are not permitted to make a profit as a result of this award or charge a management fee for the performance of this award.

What's It For? OJJDP will award funding to support agencies that utilize a comprehensive, multidisciplinary approach to provide intervention and supervision services for youth with sexual behavior problems and treatment services for their child victims and families. Award recipients will target for services pre- or post-adjudicated youth who are charged with an offense involving inappropriate sexual behavior with a child and who have no prior history of court involvement for sexual misconduct. Award recipients will also provide services to victims and families.

When's It Due? Applications are due July 25, 2013.

Solicitation Title: OJJDP, FY 2013 Support to the Attorney General's Task Force on American Indian/Alaska Native Children Exposed to Violence

Who Can Apply? Applicants are limited to tribal and non-tribal non-profit and for-profit organizations, and tribal and non-tribal institutions of higher education. Consistent with OJP fiscal requirements, for-profit organizations are not permitted to make a profit as a result of this award or charge a management fee for the performance of this award.

What's It For? OJJDP, in partnership with the Department of the Interior (DOI), Bureau of Indian Affairs, will support an organization that will assist the Attorney General's Task Force on American Indian/Alaska Native Children Exposed to Violence (AI/AN Task Force) to conduct public hearings and listening sessions in American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) communities

to help the AI/AN Task Force gain a fuller understanding of the issues surrounding AI/AN children's exposure to violence. In addition, the organization will provide primary technical writing services for the final report from which the AI/AN Task Force may draw specific policy recommendations and provide all necessary support for the AI/AN Task Force and the public hearings.

When's It Due? Applications are due July 29, 2013.
