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## **WOMAN IS SENTENCED IN CREDIT CARD SCAM CASE**

ROCHESTER, N.Y.-- U.S. Attorney William J. Hochul, Jr. announced today that Kelly Grice, 32, of Rochester, NY, who was convicted of the unauthorized use of an access device, was sentenced to five years probation and ordered to pay \$13, 270.27 in restitution by U.S. District Judge Charles J. Siragusa.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Tiffany H. Lee, who handled the case, stated that the defendant, along with others, participated in a scheme to obtain gift cards and merchandise by using falsely obtained credit card numbers. Some of the individuals had access to a 1-800 number allowing them to pose as retail merchants for Big Lots, Marathon Oil or Citgo. With this 1-800 number, the participants dialed in and verified credit card numbers which were fraudulently acquired. The participants then made purchases using credit card numbers. Grice drove many of the participants to various retailers where the purchases were made. The defendant also purchased items using the credit card numbers.

The sentencing is the culmination of an investigation on the part of Special Agents the United States Secret Service under the direction of Special Agent in Charge Tracy Gast, the New York State Police, the Irondequoit Police Department and Rochester Police Department.

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
