## **FLORIDA SEX OFFENDER IS SENTENCED IN FAILURE TO REGISTER CASE**

ROCHESTER, N.Y.-- U.S. Attorney William J. Hochul, Jr. announced today that Nicholas Hayes, 48, of Pasco County, Florida, who was convicted of failing to register as a sex offender, was sentenced to 15 months in prison and five years of supervised release by U.S. District Judge Charles J. Siragusa.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Tiffany H. Lee, who handled the case, stated that the defendant was a registered sex offender as a result of four convictions of lewd and lascivious acts involving a child in the state of Florida. Hayes last updated his sex offender registration in November 2010 and acknowledged that he was to report to the local Sheriff's office within 48 hours of relocating to another state. According to Florida law enforcement, he left the state without doing so. Hayes resided in Pennsylvania from Christmas 2010 through mid-February 2011 and most recently, he resided in Steuben County, in Lindley, New York.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.
