This course focuses on how to formulate objectives; select, organize content for instruction and materials for distribution; present information effectively, using multifaceted methods (lecture, panel, workshop); handle questions effectively during presentations; create and use PowerPoint/visual aids; and generate interaction in small group discussion learning.</p>

Delivery methods include interactive lectures, facilitated breakout groups, roundtable discussions and participant group presentations.
