CONSENT PERMANENT INJUNCTION

The Plaintiff, the United States of America, and the Defendants, Iliff's Camps & Clinics and Theresa Iliff, hereby consent to the entry of this permanent injunction. The parties stipulate and agree that the Court has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this action. The parties also agree that the entry of this injunction is necessary and appropriate for the enforcement of the internal revenue laws and is therefore appropriate under 26 U.S.C. § 7402(a).

ORDER AND INJUNCTION


Upon the consent of the parties, and in accordance with 26 U.S.C. § 7402(a) and the Court's equitable powers, the Court issues this permanent injunction ordering that the Defendants, for a period of five years:

1. Timely make Federal Tax Deposits of Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA), Federal Insurance Contribution Act (FICA), and federal income withholding tax liabilities as required by law after the date of the entry of the injunction;
2. Timely file all federal employment and unemployment tax returns (Forms 941 and 940, respectively);

3. Provide proof to the Internal Revenue Service, no later than the 20th of each month that the required income and employment taxes were paid to the Internal Revenue Service. Proof of payment shall be sent to the Internal Revenue Service at 1 Kalisa Way, Paramus, NJ 07652, or such other locations as the Internal Revenue Service may designate;
4. Timely pay outstanding federal employment and unemployment tax liabilities due on each return required to be filed; and
5. Pay all income and employment taxes required to be withheld from its employees' wages before assigning any property or making any disbursements.

Any failure by Iliff's Camps & Clinics and Theresa L. Iliff to comply with this permanent injunction may constitute a contempt of this Court's Order, and may subject the Defendants to sanctions, including monetary penalties and/or incarceration. The Court will retain jurisdiction over this case to ensure compliance with this injunction.
