ORDER AND JUDGMENT ENTRY

Nycom, Inc., doing business as Aamco of Lima, et al.,

Having considered the Plaintiff's unopposed motion for default judgment and finding there are no disputed issues of fact, I further find the Plaintiff is entitled to judgment as a matter of law.

Accordingly, I order the following:

- 1. Plaintiff's motion for default judgment (Doc. No. 9) is granted;
- 2. Defendants Nycom and William E. Numbers, Sr. shall deposit in an appropriate federal depository bank, in accord with federal deposit regulations, withheld employee income tax, withheld employee FICA tax, and employer FICA tax, all required by the Internal Revenue Code;
- 3. Nycom and William E. Numbers, Sr. shall sign and deliver affidavits to the Internal Revenue Service at 401 W. North Street, Room 225, Lima, Ohio 45801, or to such other location designated by the IRS, no later than the 20th day of each month, beginning in July 2015, stating that the requisite deposits of withheld income tax, withheld FICA tax, employer FICA tax, and unemployment tax have been made in a timely manner;

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4. Nycom and William E. Numbers, Sr. shall timely file all Forms 941, Forms 940, and

Forms 1120 with the IRS at 401 W. North Street, Room 225, Lima, Ohio 45801, or such

other location designated by the IRS;

5. William E. Numbers, Sr. shall timely make a quarterly estimated tax payment of personal

income taxes to the IRS at 401 W. North Street, Room 225, Lima, Ohio 45810 or such

other location designated by the IRS;

6. Nycom and William E. Numbers, Sr. are enjoyed from transferring, disbursing, or

assigning any money, property, or assets or from paying other creditors after the

preliminary injunction is issued until the employment tax and withholding liabilities,

accruing after issuance of the injunction, are first properly deposited or paid to the IRS;

7. Nycom and William E. Numbers, Sr. shall timely pay all outstanding liabilities due to

each return required to be filed herein;

8. William E. Numbers, Sr. shall notify the IRS of any new related or associated company

that he may to manage or own within the next five (5) years;

9. This Court retains jurisdiction over the Defendants and this action for purpose of

enforcing this Permanent Injunction; and

10. This injunction shall remain in effect for a period of five years. The five year period is

without prejudice to the Government's right to move to extend the period or to seek

another injunction.
