## AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF CRIMINAL COMPLAINT AND ARREST WARRANT

## **PURPOSE OF AFFIDAVIT**

1. This Affidavit is submitted in support of a Criminal Complaint charging

TR STA C A D ER STEVE S (STEVE S) ith violations of 18 U.S.C. §§ 111(b), 231(a)(3), 1752(a), (b), and 40 U.S.C. § 5104(e)(2).

## AGENT BACKGROUND

2. have been a Special Agent ith the B since ctober of 2007, here am currently assigned to a s uad hich investigates narcotics traffic ing offenses. Since ctober 2008, have been or ing on federal narcotics investigations and have participated in investigations hich have led to the indictments and arrests of narcotics distributors. Since 2007, have received training and e perience in intervie ing and interrogation techni ues, arrest

procedures, search and sei ure, narcotics, hite collar crimes, search arrant applications, and various other crimes. n the course of my training and e perience, have become familiar ith the methods and techni ues associated ith the distribution of narcotics, the laundering of drug proceeds, and the organi ation of drug conspiracies. have also had e tensive e perience ith various forms of electronic evidence, such as cell phone data and social media evidence, as it relates to criminal activity.

3. am one of the investigators assigned to an ongoing investigation by the B, United States Capitol olice (USC), Metropolitan olice Department (MD), and other la enforcement agencies, of riots and civil disorder that occurred on January, 2021, in and around the United States Capitol grounds. Since became involved in this investigation on January, 2021, have conducted intervie s, revie ed public tips, revie ed publicly available photos and video, and revie ed relevant documents, among other things.

4. The facts in this affidavit come from my revie of the evidence, my personal observations, my training and e perience, and information obtained from other la enforcement officers and itnesses. E cept as e plicitly set forth belo , have not distinguished in this affidavit bet een facts of hich have personal no ledge and facts of hich have hearsay no ledge. This affidavit is intended to sho simply that there is sufficient probable cause for the re uested arrest arrant and does not set forth all of my no ledge about this matter.

#### BACKGROUND

n January , 2021, a oint session of the United States Congress convened at the
United States Capitol, located at irst Street Southeast, Washington, District of Columbia.
During the oint session, elected members of the United States ouse of Representatives and

Senate met in the United States Capitol to certify the vote count of the Electoral College for the 2020 residential Election, hich too place on ovember 3, 2020.

6. The United States Capitol is secured 24 hours a day by security barriers and USC occupy various posts throughout the grounds. Restrictions around the United States Capitol include permanent and temporary security barriers and posts manned by USC . USC officers ore uniforms ith clearly mar ed police patches, insignia, badges, and other la enforcement e uipment. nly authori ed people ith appropriate identification are allo ed access inside the United States Capitol. n January , 2021, the e terior pla a of the United States Capitol as also closed to members of the public.

7. The January , 2021 oint session began at appro imately 1 00 p.m. Shortly thereafter, by appro imately 1 30 p.m., the ouse and Senate ad ourned to separate chambers to resolve a particular ob ection. Vice resident Michael R. ence as present and presiding, first in the oint session, and then in the Senate chamber.

8. As the proceedings continued in both the ouse and the Senate, and ith Vice resident ence present and presiding over the Senate, a large cro d gathered outside the United States Capitol. As noted above, temporary and permanent barricades ere in place around the e terior of the United States Capitol building and USC ere present, attempting to eep the cro d a ay from the Capitol building and the proceedings under ay inside. As the certification proceedings ere under ay, the e terior doors and indo s of the Capitol ere loc ed or other ise secured.

9. At appro imately 2 00 p.m., certain individuals in the cro d forced their ay through, up, and over the barricades, and past officers of the USC, and the cro d advanced to the e terior fa ade of the building. The cro d as not la fully authori ed to enter or remain in

the building and, prior to entering the building, no members of the cro d submitted to security screenings or eapons chec s by the USC or other authori ed security officials.

10. A short time later, at appro-imately 2 20 p.m., members of the United States ouse of Representatives and United States Senate, including the resident of the Senate, Vice resident ence, ere instructed to and did evacuate the chambers. As such, all proceedings of the United States Congress, including the oint session, ere effectively suspended until shortly after 8 00 p.m. the same day. n light of the dangerous circumstances caused by the unla ful entry to the United States Capitol, including the danger posed by individuals ho had entered the United States Capitol ithout any security screening or eapons chec , Congressional proceedings could not resume until after every unauthori ed occupant had left the United States Capitol, and the building had been confirmed secured. The proceedings resumed at appro-imately 8 00 pm after the building had been secured. Vice resident ence remained in the United States Capitol from the time he as evacuated from the Senate Chamber until the sessions resumed.

11. After the Capitol as breached, USC re uested assistance from M D and other la enforcement agencies in the area to protect the Capitol, eep more people from entering the Capitol, and e pel the cro d that as inside the Capitol. Multiple M D officers and other la enforcement officers came to assist.

12. During national ne s coverage of the aforementioned events, video footage hich appeared to be captured on mobile devices of persons present on the scene depicted evidence of violations of local and federal la , including scores of individuals inside the United States Capitol building ithout authority to be there.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS SUPPORTING PROBABLE CAUSE

By 3 00 M on January , 2021, protesters had engulfed the est side of the 13. ere climbing on the scaffolding in front of building as ell as various features of Capitol and the building. Although the Capitol Building had already been breached and protesters had flooded in through several entrances, a group of M D officers and members of the USC or other agencies had been able to hold their position and deny entry through the very prominent entrance of the lo er est terrace. To enter the Capitol through the lo er est terrace, one must al through a short tunnel ith a series of glass door ays. Shortly before 3 00 M, a group of officers ere maintaining a line at the second set of glass doors inside the tunnel. fficers reporting to the scene rushed to the tunnel from ithin the building hile protesters outside of the tunnel continued to summon more men to push their ay through the tunnel. A gro ing number of protesters made their ay into the tunnel ith a variety of tools and eapons and the tunnel became the point of one of the more intense and prolonged clashes bet een protesters and la enforcement at the Capitol on that day. Many of the protesters in the tunnel ere recording video and many of the videos continue to circulate nternet channels, social media, and the ne s.

14. ortions of the rioters effort in the tunnel to get through the lo er est terrace doors ere captured both in video surveillance from USC camera in the tunnel and in video footage posted to ouTube (hereinafter, ouTube Video 1). n ouTube Video 1, hich as revie ed by your affiant, a large group of rioters attempted to brea through the line of uniformed la enforcement officers ho ere in place to prevent rioters from entering the lo er est terrace door of the United States Capitol. a enforcement officers are at the front of the line attempting to stop numerous rioters from gaining access to the United States Capitol Building.

15. Around 2.4 p.m., surveillance video sho s a hite male ith bro n hair, a bro n beard, and glasses, earing a bro n ac et ith a lighter colored hood and a blac

bac pac , ho as subse uently identified as STEVE S, as e plained belo , can first be seen near the entrance of the tunnel. STEVE S can then be seen entering the tunnel ith the rioters,

ho begin to push against the officers as a group. STEVE S can be seen in surveillance footage yelling and placing 1, then 2, and then 3 fingers in the air, ith the cro d then pushing for ard as he puts up 3 fingers. Surveillance footage sho s that this continues a fe times until someone at the front urges everyone to bac up, at hich point Stevens can be seen aiving to the cro d to bac up. n both the surveillance footage and ouTube Video 1, STEVE S (in the red bo in the still from ouTube Video 1, in igure 1, belo ) then e its the tunnel ith some of the rioters but stays near the arch by the entrance, loo ing to ards the direction of here the front line of the rioters continue to clash ith la enforcement inside the tunnel.

16. Then, at appro-imately 2.5 p.m., STEVE S can be seen in surveillance footage going bac into the tunnel ith additional rioters along to ard the line of la enforcement guarding the lo er est terrace doors. STEVE S can be seen holding hat appears to be a cellular phone in his hand ith the light on as he along for ard into the tunnel.

17. Then, at appro-imately 2 58 p.m., STEVE S can be seen in surveillance footage turning around and again e-iting the tunnel as other rioter continue to try force their ay through

the lo er est terrace doors.

18. Then, at appro-imately 3 03 p.m., STEVE S (as indicated in the red bo in igure 2 belo) can be seen in surveillance footage again returning to the tunnel and moving to ards the line of la enforcement officers guarding the lo er est terrace doors, as rioters push in unison against the officers.

19. As captured in ouTube Video 1, inside the tunnel, rioters use police riot shields and police riot batons to combat uniformed la enforcement officers. Unidentified rioters can also be overheard planning and implementing a rotation of rioters to have the fresh rioters up front to combat la enforcement, ith various unidentified individuals yelling e need fresh patriots in the front and e need fresh people. Unidentified rioters are heard instructing the front line of rioters to ma e a shield all to prevent la enforcement from controlling rioters ith oleoresin capsicum spray ( .C. spray ). Around the same time, STEVE S can be seen grabbing one of the riot shields that is being passed for ard by others in another video posted to

ouTube ( ouTube Video 2 ), as sho n in igure 3, belo . That conduct depicted in ouTube Video 2 is corroborated by surveillance footage hich sho s STEVE S ith the riot shield around 3 0 p.m. igure 4, belo , is a still obtained from the surveillance footage; STEVE S is sho n ithin the red bo in igure 4

20. ouTube Video 1 sho s that, after STEVE S then pushes his ay to the front of the line of rioters ith the shield, STEVE S as holding the shield and using it to push against the line of officers as the rioters add their eight and push him too. ouTube Video 1 also sho s that, at one point, the shield STEVE S is holding also stri es an officer in the helmet. At another point, ouTube Video 1 also sho s an officer thrust his baton over a shield in an

apparent attempt to po e one of the protesters and sho s that STEVE S grabbed the baton and, in a brief struggle, tried to ta e it from the officer, as sho n in igure 5, belo .

21. Then, at appro-imately 3 11 p.m., STEVE S, ho no longer holds a shield, can be seen in surveillance footage again e iting the tunnel and moving bac a ay from the line of la enforcement officers guarding the lo er est terrace doors.

22. Then, around 4 15 p.m., STEVE S can be seen in surveillance footage returning to the tunnel, ith the grey hood on his head but other ise appearing the same, and once again oining a large group of rioters pushing against la enforcement officers guarding the lo er est terrace doors. The rioters push as a cro d against the officers for a fe minutes. Around 4 1 p.m., STEVE S can be seen aiving the group bac and begins e iting the tunnel again as la enforcement officers finally push the group bac to the arch entrance.

## Identification of STEVENS

23. a enforcement spo e ith Witness 1 and Witness 2, both of hom have no n STEVE S personally for many years. Witness 1 and Witness 2 ere each sho n the belo still,

igure , from another video of the event posted to ouTube, (ouTube Video 3). Each identified the individual on the left hose face is visible in the still as STEVE S. Both ere able to provide the date of birth for STEVE S and additional details, including his phone number all of hich matched information previously no n to la enforcement regarding STEVE S. W T ESS 1 and W T ESS 2 also confirmed that STEVE S travelled to Washington D.C. in the first part of the month of January 2021.

24. a enforcement also separately spo e ith Witness 3, ho has no n STEVE S personally for months. Witness 3 as sho n igures 7, 8, and from the videos described above. Witness 3 identified the individual in the photographs as STEVE S.

25. n addition, your affiant and other investigators e amined several photographs e tracted from videos recorded by protesters inside or ust outside of the tunnel ith several photographs of STEVE S from his social media accounts, as ell as photos from no n government sources. Based on that comparison, your affiant concurs that STEVE S resembles the individual pictured above. otably, in an Alabama driver s license photograph of STEVE S, a mole is visible on his right chee . n ouTube Video 3, hich as partially ta en outside of the tunnel, a mole can be seen on the same location on STEVE S s right chee as he al s past the camera, as circled in the still belo .

#### **CONCLUSION**

or the reasons set forth above, submit there is probable cause to believe that STEVE S violated

- 18 U.S.C. § 111(b), hich ma es it a crime to forcibly assault or interfere ith any person designated in section 1114 of this title 18 hile engaged in or on account of the performance of official duties and uses a deadly or dangerous eapon (including a eapon intended to cause death or danger but that fails to do so by reason of a defective component). ersons designated ithin section 1114 include any person assisting an officer or employee of the United States in the performance of their official duties.
- 2. 18 U.S.C. § 231(a)(3), hich ma es it a crime to commit or attempt to commit any act to obstruct, impede, or interfere ith any fireman or la enforcement officer la fully engaged in the la ful performance of his official duties incident to and during the commission of a civil disorder hich in any ay or degree obstructs, delays, or adversely affects commerce or the movement of any article or commodity in commerce or the conduct or performance of any federally protected function. (Civil disorder means any public disturbance involving acts of violence by assemblages of three or more persons,

hich causes an immediate danger of or results in damage or in ury to the property or person of any other individual. ederally protected function means any function, operation, or action carried out, under the la s of the United States, by any department, agency, or instrumentality of the United States or by an officer or employee thereof; and such term shall specifically include, but not be limited to, the collection and distribution of the United States mails. 18 U.S.C. §232(1).)

- 3. 18 U.S.C. § 1752(a) and (b), hich ma e it a crime to (2) no ingly, and ith intent to impede or disrupt the orderly conduct of Government business or official functions, engage in disorderly or disruptive conduct in, or ithin such pro imity to, any restricted building or grounds hen, or so that, such conduct, in fact, impedes or disrupts the orderly conduct of Government business or official functions; or (4) no ingly engage in any act of physical violence against any person or property in any restricted building or grounds; or attempts or conspires to do so. The punishment for violating these provisions by using or carrying a dangerous eapon is imprisonment for up to 10 years. 18 U.S.C. § 1752(b)(1)(A). or purposes of Section 1752 of Title 18, a restricted building includes a posted, cordoned off, or other ise restricted area of a building or grounds here the resident or other person protected by the Secret Service is or ill be temporarily visiting; or any building or grounds so restricted in con unction ith an event designated as a special event of national significance; and
- 4. 40 U.S.C. § 5l04(e)(2), hich ma es it a crime for an individual or group of individuals to illfully and no ingly (D) utter loud, threatening, or abusive language, or engage in disorderly or disruptive conduct, at any place in the Grounds or in any of the Capitol Buildings ith the intent to impede, disrupt, or disturb the orderly conduct of a session of Congress or either ouse of Congress, or the orderly conduct in that building of a hearing before, or any deliberations of, a committee of Congress or either ouse of Congress; or () engage in an act of physical violence in the Grounds or any of the Capitol Buildings.

As such, your affiant respectfully re uests that the court issue an arrest arrant for STEVE S. The statements above are true and accurate to the best of my no ledge and belief.
