MINUTE ORDER. The Court has been informed that (1) in 2002, Congress enacted the Supplemental Appropriations Act for Further Recovery From and Response to Terrorist Attacks on the United States, Pub. L. No. 107-206, 116 Stat. 832, in connection with the trial of Zacarias Moussaoui, United States v. Moussaoui, Crim. No. 1-455-A (E.D. Va. 2003), and (2) consistent with that law, the district court for the Eastern District of Virginia entered an order(s) that, among other things, allowed verified victims to watch the trial proceedings on closed-circuit television in several U.S. courthouses; designated a retired judicial officer to preside over each remote proceeding; directed the Department of Justice to develop, implement, and supervise procedures for such proceedings; and provided for a camera in the EDVA trial courtroom.

For purposes of the Court's consideration of the Act to Provide Remote Access to Court Proceedings for Victims of the 1988 Bombing of Pan Am Flight 103 over Lockerbie, Scotland, Pub. L. No. 118-37, 138 Stat. 11 and the parties' forthcoming proposals for implementing the law, the government is directed to file, on or before February 23, 2024, (1) copies of all such orders and (2) a detailed description of the processes and procedures that were utilized in the Moussaoui case to afford closed-circuit television access to victims.

Further, on or before March 1, 2024, both parties shall file a detailed proposal(s) for providing victims access to pretrial and trial proceedings in this case. The proposal shall address all aspects of implementing the recently enacted law, including the specific locations where the

pretrial and trial proceedings shall be broadcast; the services that will be used to provide audio or video transmissions; the security of those services, as well as coordination and validation efforts with judiciary information technology officials; the processes for identifying victims and verifying their identities before and at the time of the proceedings; security at the various viewing locations; and the placement of any camera in the courtroom.
