FACTUAL BASIS

Were this matter brought to trial, the United States would prove the following by competent evidence beyond a reasonable doubt.

On or about August 20, 2015, Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) New Orleans Agents encountered defendant, Juan Alberto

Sanchez-Romero (Sanchez-Romero), at his home in Harvey, Louisiana. Agents conducted an immigration interview with Sanchez-Romero who admitted being a citizen of Mexico unlawfully in the United States. A records check confirmed that Sanchez-Romero had no legal status in the United States. In addition, Sanchez-Romero possessed a firearm; specifically, a Taurus model .22 Magnum, serial number MH66523. The agents seized the firearm and Sanchez-Romero was taken to HSI Offices where he was advised of his constitutional rights. Sanchez-Romero admitted to the agents that he illegally crossed the border from Mexico into the United States

approximately eleven years ago. Sanchez-Romero further stated that he had obtained the firearm from a former roommate.

The firearm in Sanchez-Romero's possession was manufactured in Florida, and thus, had been transported in interstate commerce.
