FACTUAL BASIS

If this matter had proceeded to trial, the United States would have proved through the introduction of competent testimony and admissible evidence, the facts below to support the allegations charged by the Government in the Bill of Information now pending against defendant **ANGEL PERILLOUX** for obstruction of justice, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1503 and 2.

On or about September 1, 2016, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (“ATF”) began a grand jury investigation into federal charges, including federal narcotics and firearms violations, and began securing evidence to present before the federal grand jury for the Eastern District of Louisiana.

On or about November 4, 2016, S.T. was arrested by Louisiana State Police Troopers on outstanding warrants related to this investigation. S.T.’s car was impounded by law enforcement and brought to Cooper’s Salvage Yard and Wrecker Service, located at 24333 LA-22, Ponchatoula,

LA 70454 (hereinafter "Cooper's"). At all material times herein, Cooper's was located in the Eastern District of Louisiana.

On or about November 4, 2016, S.T. placed a recorded telephone call from jail to **PERILLOUX**. During this call, S.T. informed **PERILLOUX** that, when S.T. was arrested, S.T. hid the "reup money" and a firearm in the vehicle that was now at Cooper's. During this call, **PERILLOUX** offered to retrieve the items from the vehicle. The purpose of retrieving this evidence was to prevent law enforcement from obtaining it.

After speaking with S.T., **PERILLOUX** approached D.C., and offered to give him approximately \$300.00 in United States currency if he were to break into Cooper's and retrieve the drug money and firearm that were hidden in S.T.'s vehicle. On two occasions between on or about November 4, 2016 and November 6, 2016, **PERILLOUX** drove D.C. to Cooper's. **PERILLOUX** circled the block while D.C. attempted to retrieve the items from S.T.'s vehicle. On a third occasion, D.C. walked to Cooper's and attempted to retrieve the evidence from S.T.'s vehicle. D.C. was ultimately unsuccessful, because he was afraid of being apprehended by law enforcement.

In a recorded jail call on November 5, 2016, **PERILLOUX** informed S.T. that she had sent D.C. to Cooper's the night before. In another recorded jail call on November 6, 2016, **PERILLOUX** indicated that D.C. had attempted to retrieve the items again the night before, but was scared off by a sheriff's car. During the November 6, 2016 call, Perilloux stated that she had asked a "boy that works at Cooper's" to help retrieve the items from S.T.'s vehicle. She indicated that she would "give him a couple hundred bucks" if he succeeded.

On or about November 6, 2016, **PERILLOUX** approached a Cooper's employee and offered to pay him if he were to retrieve the items from S.T.'s vehicle. On a date unknown but

prior to November 9, 2016, the Cooper's employee retrieved cash and a Cobra Model FS380, .380 caliber semi-automatic pistol bearing serial number FS103821, from S.T.'s vehicle at Cooper's, and provided the items to **PERILLOUX**.


On or about November 9, 2016, ATF agents searched S.T.'s vehicle at Cooper's in furtherance of the federal grand jury investigation. Agents were unable to locate any firearms or currency in the vehicle.

This proffer of evidence is not intended to constitute a complete statement of all facts known to the Government, but rather is a minimum statement of facts intended to prove the necessary factual predicate for the guilty plea. The limited purpose of this proffer is to demonstrate that there exists a sufficient factual and legal basis for **ANGEL PERILLOUX's** plea of guilty to the Bill of Information charging **PERILLOUX** with violating 18 United States Code, Sections 1503 and 2.
