**FACTUAL BASIS**

The defendant, **FREDY ANTONIO MENDOZA-CHIRINO** (hereinafter "**CHIRINOS**"), has agreed to plead guilty as charged to the one-count indictment charging him with illegal reentry of a previously removed alien in violation of Title 8, United States Code, Section 1326(a).

Should this matter have gone to trial, the government would have proven, through the introduction of competent testimony and other admissible evidence, the following facts, beyond a reasonable doubt, to support the allegations in the indictment now pending against the defendant:


On June 17, 2018, **CHIRINOS** was arrested by the St. Tammany Parish Sheriff's Office for driving while intoxicated, careless operation and failure to have liability insurance. He failed to appear for his court date and was arrested on a on a contempt warrant by St. Tammany Parish authorities on November 21, 2018.


On November 21, 2018, St. Tammany Parish released **CHIRINOS** to the custody of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Immigration and Customs Enforcement (hereinafter "ICE").



During processing, **CHIRINOS** was interviewed and admitted to being a citizen of Honduras and illegally present in the United States. The agent then checked various immigration databases and determined that **CHIRINOS** was indeed a citizen of Honduras, and that he had no claim to United States citizenship. The record checks also confirmed that **CHIRINOS** had been removed from the United States on August 17, 2017, from Alexandria, Louisiana. Testimony of an official from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services regarding record checks conducted through the Computer Linked Application Information Management System would show that the defendant, **CHIRINOS**, did not receive consent from the U.S. Attorney General or his designated successor, the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security, to apply for readmission or receive permission to reenter the United States since the time of the defendant's previous removal.
