The Grand Jury charges that:

**COUNT 1**

(Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon)

On or about December 23, 2020, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, knowing that he had been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, to wit: a conviction on January 23, 2012, in Orleans Parish Criminal District Court, State of Louisiana, Case Number 506-805 "H," for possession of cocaine in violation of LA-R.S. 40:967; did knowingly possess a firearm, that is a 7.62x39 mm

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firearm, said firearm having been shipped and transported in interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).

**COUNT 2**

(Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon)

On or about January 29, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, knowing that he had been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, to wit: a conviction on January 23, 2012, in Orleans Parish Criminal District Court, State of Louisiana, Case Number 506-805 “H,” for possession of cocaine in violation of LA-R.S. 40:967; did knowingly possess a firearm, that is a Glock 23 .40 caliber handgun with an extended magazine, said firearm having been shipped and transported in interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).

**COUNT 3**

(Possession of Ammunition by a Convicted Felon)

On or about January 29, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, knowing that he had been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, to wit: a conviction on January 23, 2012, in Orleans Parish Criminal District Court, State of Louisiana, Case Number 506-805 “H,” for possession of cocaine in violation of LA-R.S. 40:967; did knowingly possess ammunition, that is seventy-two rounds Winchester USA 5.56mm ammunition, thirty-four rounds of Frontier 5.56 ammunition, one round of Smith and Wesson .40 caliber ammunition, and twenty-one rounds of Fiocchi GFL 9mm ammunition; said rounds of ammunition having been shipped and transported in interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).

**COUNT 4**

(Possession with Intent to Distribute a Controlled Substance)

On or about January 29, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, knowingly and intentionally possessed with the intent to distribute a quantity of cocaine, a Schedule II controlled substance; in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(C).

**COUNT 5**

(Possession with Intent to Distribute a Controlled Substance)

On or about January 29, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, did knowingly and intentionally possess with the intent to distribute a quantity of a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of heroin, a Schedule I drug controlled substance, and a quantity of a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of N-phenyl-N-[1-(2-phenylethyl)-4-piperidinyl] propanamide, that is, fentanyl, a Schedule II drug controlled substance, in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(C).

**COUNT 6**

(Possession of a Firearm in Furtherance of Drug Trafficking Crime)

On or about January 29, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, did knowingly possess a firearm, that is, a Glock 23 .40 caliber handgun, in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime for which he may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance, as charged in Counts 4 and 5; all in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(c)(1)(A)(i).

**NOTICE OF FORFEITURE**

1. The allegations of Counts 1 through 6 of this Indictment are incorporated by reference as though set forth fully herein for the purpose of alleging forfeiture to the United States.

2. As a result of the offense alleged in Counts 4 and 5, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, shall forfeit to the United States pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853, any property constituting or derived from any proceeds obtained directly or indirectly as the result of said offense, and any property used or intended to be used in any manner or part to commit or to facilitate the commission of said offenses, including but not limited to:

7.62x39 mm firearm, unknown serial number;

Glock 23, .40 caliber Handgun with extended magazine, bearing serial number BHVZ390;

Glock .40 magazine with 15 rounds;

Tapco 7.62 magazine;

SGM tactical .45 magazine;

72 - Winchester USA 5.56 rounds;

21 - Fiocchi GFL 9mm rounds;

Black firearm foregrip;

1- S&W .40 caliber round;

34 - Frontier 5.56 rounds.

3. As a result of the offenses alleged in Counts 1, 2 3, and 6, the defendant, **CHRISTOPHER MAY**, shall forfeit to the United States pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d)(1), and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c), any firearm or ammunition involved in or used in the commission of said offenses, including but not limited to any firearm or ammunition described above.

4. If any of the above-described property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:


a. cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;

- b. has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person;
- c. has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court;
- d. has been substantially diminished in value; or
- e. has been commingled with other property which cannot be subdivided without difficulty;

the United States shall seek a money judgment and, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), forfeiture of any other property of the defendant up to the value of said property.
