The Grand Jury charges that:

COUNT 1

(Possession with Intent to Distribute a Controlled Substance)

On or about November 6, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **DANTE FRAZIER**, knowingly and intentionally possessed with the intent to distribute fifty

grams or more of a mixture of substance containing a detectable amount of methamphetamine, a

Schedule I controlled substance; a quantity of cocaine base ("crack"), a Schedule II controlled substance; and a quantity of a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of N-phenyl
N-[1-(2-phenylethyl)-4-piperidinyl] propanamide, that is, fentanyl, a Schedule II controlled substance, in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1), 841(b)(1)(B), and

841(b)(1)(C).

COUNT 2

(Using, Carrying and Discharging a Firearm During and in Relation to a Drug Trafficking Crime)

On or about November 6, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **DANTE FRAZIER**, did knowingly use, carry and discharge a firearm during and in relation to a drug trafficking crime for which he may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance, as charged in Count 1, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(c)(1)(A)(iii).

COUNT 3

(Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon)

On or about November 6, 2021, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **DANTE FRAZIER**, knowing that he had been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, to wit: a conviction on January 17, 2002, in Orleans Parish Criminal District Court, State of Louisiana, case number 421-316 "D," for armed robbery in violation of La. R.S. 14:64, and a conviction on October 26, 2021, in the 34th Judicial District Court of Louisiana, Case No. 21-03290, for possession with intent to distribute marijuana in violation of La. R.S. 40:966; did knowingly possess a firearm, that is a Mossberg International 715P, .22 caliber handgun, bearing serial number EUD4457353, said firearm being in and affecting interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).

NOTICE OF FORFEITURE

- 1. The allegations of Counts 1 through 3 of this Indictment are incorporated by reference as though set forth fully herein for the purpose of alleging forfeiture to the United States.
- 2. As a result of the offense alleged in Count 1, the defendant, **DANTE FRAZIER**, shall forfeit to the United States pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853, any property constituting or derived from any proceeds obtained directly or indirectly as the result of said

offenses, and any property used or intended to be used in any manner or part to commit or to facilitate the commission of said offense.

3. As a result of the offenses alleged in Counts 2 and 3, the defendant, **DANTE FRAZIER**, shall forfeit to the United States pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d)(1), and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c), any firearm or ammunition involved in or used in the commission of said offenses, including but not limited to the following:

Mossberg International 715P, .22 caliber handgun, bearing serial number EUD4457353.

- 4. If any of the above-described property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:
 - a. cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
 - b. has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person;
 - c. has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court;
 - d. has been substantially diminished in value; or
 - e. has been commingled with other property which cannot be subdivided without difficulty;

the United States shall seek a money judgment and, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), forfeiture of any other property of the defendant up to the value of said property.
