



What is Fraud Bingo?

A fun and interactive presentation that teaches consumers how to protect themselves from investment and other financial fraud by playing a familiar game: Bingo!

How do I play?

Play just like you would regular Bingo but with an added twist. Each time the Bingo game caller announces a square, the participants who have a match will read aloud the accompanying message found on their bingo card. The winner shouts "Fraud Bingo!" It is as simple as that.

What will I learn?

You will learn how to detect investment fraud by identifying common scams, being aware of local scams affecting your own city or town, and learning techniques to protect yourself from this financial abuse.

What does it cost?

The Fraud Bingo program is free of charge.
