INDICTMENT

The Grand Jury charges:

COUNT ONE

On or about November 21, 2014, in the Middle District of Florida, and elsewhere, the defendant

PETER NEES,

the defendant herein, did knowingly and willfully make false, fictitious and fraudulent material statements and representations in a matter within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), an agency of the United States, that is the defendant falsely stated to OSHA investigators in the course of their investigation of a workplace accident that resulted in a fatality that he did not alter the scene of the accident in any way after the accident occurred when, in truth and fact, he knew those statements were false.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1001.

COUNT TWO

On or about December 15, 2014, in the Middle District of Florida, and elsewhere, the defendant

PETER NEES,

the defendant herein, did knowingly and willfully make false, fictitious and fraudulent material statements and representations in a matter within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), an agency of the United States, that is the defendant falsely stated to OSHA investigators in the course of their investigation of a workplace accident that resulted in a fatality that he did not alter the scene of the accident in any way after the accident occurred when, in truth and fact, he knew those statements were false.


