



Minnesota Tribal Intergovernmental Reentry Workshop

Registration Now Open

The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) Office of Justice Programs' (OJP) Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), along with the American Probation and Parole Association, is partnering with the Minnesota Department of Corrections (DOC), Lower Sioux Indian Community, and the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe to provide a comprehensive, in-person Tribal Intergovernmental Reentry Workshop (TIRW). The TIRW is for tribes who have, or are interested in having, a reentry program to serve tribal members returning to the community from federal, state, local, or tribal correctional facilities. This TIRW is designed to provide participants with the tools to develop effective reentry plans based on sharing operational, organizational, and culture-based concepts and processes that identify critical services and interventions needed to reduce recidivism and victimization within Minnesota. **We received DOJ conference approval, the Minnesota TIRW specific to Minnesota tribes will take place from August 28 to August 30 in Morton, MN.**

The TIRW has been developed as a team training. In order to optimize the training experience, each participating Minnesota tribe should create a team of **FIVE (5) to EIGHT (8)** officials with decision-making authority from tribal, state, and local governmental and program offices relevant to your reentry program and/or planning process. Team members may include, but are not limited to, the following: (1) reentry coordinator/case manager, (2) court/judiciary staff, (3) behavioral health/health services/Indian Health Services staff, (4) community-based service provider representative, (5) community resource person, (6) victims' services representative, (7) tribal probation officer, (8) tribal prosecutor, (9) detention/corrections staff, (10) law enforcement representative (i.e. Chief of Police), (11) budget/finance staff, and (12) Tribal Administration representative.
