COUNT ONE

Between on or about October 1, 2015, and on or about May 15, 2018, in the Northern District of Florida and elsewhere, the defendant,

JOSEPH OWUSU,

did knowingly and willfully combine, conspire, confederate, and agree with other persons to distribute and possess with intent to distribute a controlled substance, and this offense involved hydromorphone and oxycodone, in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(C).

All in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 846.

CRIMINAL FORFEITURE

The allegations contained in Count One of this Information are hereby realleged and incorporated by reference for the purpose of alleging forfeiture pursuant to the provisions of Title 21, United States Code, Section 853.

From his engagement in the violation alleged in Count One punishable by imprisonment for more than one year, the defendant,

JOSEPH OWUSU,

shall forfeit to the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Sections 853(a)(1) and (2), all of his interest in:

- A. Property constituting or derived from any proceeds the defendant obtained directly or indirectly as the result of such violation.
- B. Property used in any manner or part to commit or to facilitate the commission of such violation.

If any of the property subject to forfeiture as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- i. cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- ii. has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person;
- iii. has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of this Court;
- iv. has been substantially diminished in value; or

v. has been commingled with other property that cannot be divided without difficulty,

it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code,
Section 853(p), to seek forfeiture of any other property of said defendant up to the

value of the above forfeitable property.
