The enclosed information is provided by the United States Department of Justice Victim Notification System (VNS). As a victim witness professional, my role is to assist you with information and services during the prosecution of this case. You have been designated to receive notifications on behalf of the following victim(s) (or potential victims) identified by law enforcement during the investigation of the case: [REDACTED].

A hearing before Judge Cheryl Zwart is scheduled on July 15, 2020, 11:00 AM at in Courtroom 1, Robert V. Denney Federal Building, 100 Centennial Mall North, Lincoln, NE for the case which involves defendant(s) Titus Miller. The purpose of this hearing is for the defendant(s) to enter a plea of guilty. Your attendance is not required. If you are a victim of the charged offense(s) and wish to speak at the plea hearing, please call our office well in advance of the scheduled hearing date.

**The defendant is set to plea guilty at this hearing. He will be pleading to the five counts of production of child pornography, listed in the indictment. Each count is eligible for a 15-30 year sentence in prison, up to 150 years maximum.**

**The defendant will not be sentenced at this hearing, a date will be set for sentencing after he pleads guilty. The court will sentence in accordance to the above, it is unlikely he will receive the maximum. However, the court makes that decision at the time of sentencing. There is no parole in the federal system.**

Because of the Court's schedule, hearing dates could change on very short notice. If you plan on attending, you may want to call the VNS Call Center or check the website to confirm the date and time. Please note, there is a 24-hour delay in information transfer to the website.

**Reminder: Please contact our office prior to appearing for this proceeding.** It is not uncommon for the court schedule to change before we can notify you of the change in a timely manner. Your contact may save you an unnecessary trip to court. Email notification is a way to eliminate the delay in time of waiting for regular mail service. Through the Victim Notification System (VNS) we will continue to provide you with updated scheduling and event information as the case proceeds through the criminal justice system. You may obtain current information about this case on the VNS website at <https://www.notify.usdoj.gov> or from the VNS Call Center at 1-866-DOJ-4YOU (1-866-365-4968) (TDD/TTY: 1-866-228-4619) (International: 1-502-213-2767). In addition, you may use the Call Center or Internet to update your contact information and/or change your

decision about participation in the notification program.

For many VNS registrants email will provide the most timely notification. VNS does not currently have an email address for you. You can provide VNS an email address by accessing the VNS Internet Web page using the login information provided below. By entering your email as part of the VNS registration process future notifications will be delivered by email, except in rare circumstances when you might also receive a letter from VNS. In order to continue to receive notifications, it is your responsibility to keep your contact information current.

You will use your Victim Identification Number (VIN) [REDACTED] and Personal Identification Number (PIN) [REDACTED] anytime you contact the Call Center and the first time you log into VNS on the website. If you are receiving notifications with multiple victim ID/PIN codes please contact the VNS Call Center. In addition, the first time you access the VNS website, you will be prompted to enter your last name (or business name) as currently contained in VNS. The name you should enter is [REDACTED]

Remember, VNS is an automated system and cannot answer questions. If you have other questions which involve this matter, please contact this office at the number listed above.

## **COVID-19 Update**<sup>i</sup>

Letter notifications from the Victim Notification System (VNS) may be delayed as a result of the availability of staff at government agencies during the COVID-19 outbreak. The other methods of notification provided by VNS (email, the VNS Internet site, toll-free telephone number) will continue in operation and will provide timely information. If you have not already done so, we suggest you access the VNS web site (<https://www.notify.usdoj.gov>) and enter a verified email address to receive email notifications from VNS. Registrants of VNS with a verified email address will receive the same notification information via email as provided by the VNS letters. Instructions for entering a verified email address in VNS can be found at the bottom of this document.

If you plan to attend a court hearing, prior to the scheduled date of the event, be sure to contact the victim assistance staff at the United States Attorney's Office or check the web site of the U.S. District Court where the hearing is being held (<https://www.uscourts.gov>) for any special guidelines on courthouse and/or courtroom access during the Coronavirus outbreak. Please be aware that access may be limited based on government guidelines or restrictions in the local area.

You may contact the VNS Help Desk at 866.625.1631 for assistance with the registration process or for other help with the internet system. You will need to provide your VIN and PIN when contacting the Help Desk.

### **Instructions for Entering a Verified Email Address in VNS** <https://www.notify.usdoj.gov>

1. If this is the first time you have accessed this site:
  - a. You must enter the VIN/ID and PIN contained in the letter you received from the United States Attorney's Office
  - b. You will also be asked to enter either your last name, or if a business, the business name. The name must be the same as contained in the notification letter.
2. After logging into VNS
  - a. Step 1 - Create a new password. This password can be used in lieu of the VNS PIN when accessing VNS in the future
    1. VNS password must be at least 8 characters and may use letters, numbers, special characters or some combination.
  - b. Step 2 - Provide the answer to a security question
  - c. Step 3 - Enter and confirm your email address
    - i. A confirmation notice will be sent to the email you entered and your email will be "verified"
3. After completing the above steps, you can use your email address, and the password you created in Step 1, to access VNS in lieu of the VIN and PIN.
4. Entering a verified email address in VNS will eliminate letter notifications in the future and all VNS notifications will be provided by email.
