#### **INFORMATION**

The defendant having waived in open court prosecution by Indictment, the United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey charges:

#### **COUNT ONE**

From on or about December 12, 2014 through in or about March
 2015, in Union County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, defendant
 ANTHONY STANGO, a/k/a "Whitey,"

did knowingly and intentionally conspire and agree with others to distribute 500 or more grams of a mixture and substance containing a detectable amount of cocaine, a Schedule II controlled substance, contrary to Title 21, United States Code, Section 841(b)(1)(B)(ii).

In violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 846.

#### COUNT TWO

- 1. At all times relevant to this indictment the DeCavalcante crime family of La Cosa Nostra (the "DCF") was an organized criminal group based in New Jersey that operated in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere. The DCF was part of a nationwide criminal organization known by various names, including the "Mafia" and "La Cosa Nostra," which operated through entities known as "Families." The DCF was an enterprise that engaged in numerous criminal offenses, including fraud, distribution of controlled substances, prostitution and various crimes of violence.
- 2. From on or about February 14, 2015 through on or about March 8, 2015 in the Districts of New Jersey and Nevada, the defendant, ANTHONY STANGO, a/k/a "Whitey,"

did knowingly use the mail and facilities in interstate and foreign commerce, to wit: interstate wire communications between Nevada and New Jersey, with the intent to promote, manage, establish, carry on or facilitate a business enterprise involving the promotion, management, establishment or carrying on of an unlawful activity, that is, prostitution, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:34-1 and to thereafter perform and attempt to perform the commission of said offense.

In violation Title 18, United States Code, Section 1952(a)(3)(A).

#### COUNT THREE

On or about March 27, 2015, in Ocean County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, defendant

ANTHONY STANGO, a/k/a "Whitey,"

having been convicted of a crime of punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year in Middlesex County, New Jersey on February 17, 2010, did knowingly possess in and affecting commerce, a firearm, namely an H&R Pardner, 12 Gauge Shotgun, Model 1871 and serial # 626137.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g)(1) and Section 2.
