In order for this process to work, it is important that you are completely candid regarding your actual views and opinions. Everyone involved in this process is relying on what you say. We are genuinely interested in what you think. It will not help if you give answers that are politically correct or that reflect what you think we want to hear or what a “good” juror would say.

This questionnaire will be used only by the Judge and the attorneys for informational purposes during jury selection. Your answers will not be disclosed to anyone other than the Court, the attorneys representing the parties in this case, and the defendants. If you are not selected as a juror, your questionnaire will be destroyed when jury selection is complete.
