INDICTMENT

The Grand Jury in and for the District of New Jersey, sitting at Camden, charges:

<u>COUNT ONE</u> (Sexual Exploitation of Children)

From on or about March 16, 2020 through on or about April 15, 2020, in Camden County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, the defendant,

FRANCISCO ANDRES MEDINA, a/k/a "Frank Nitty," a/k/a "Frank Mula,"

did knowingly employ, use, persuade, induce, entice, and coerce a minor, that is Minor Victim 1, to engage in sexually explicit conduct, as defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 2256(2), for the purpose of producing visual depictions of such conduct, which visual depictions were produced and transmitted using materials that have been mailed, shipped and transported in and affecting interstate and foreign commerce by any means, including by cellular telephone and the Internet, and which visual depictions had actually been transported and transmitted using any means and facility of interstate and foreign commerce and in and affecting interstate and foreign commerce.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2251(a) and (e).

COUNT TWO (Receipt of Child Pornography)

On or about April 15, 2020, in Camden County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, the defendant,

FRANCISCO ANDRES MEDINA, a/k/a "Frank Nitty," a/k/a "Frank Mula,"

knowingly received child pornography, as defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 2256(8)(A), that had been mailed, and using any means and facility of interstate and foreign commerce, shipped and transported in and affecting interstate and foreign commerce by any means, including by computer.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252A(a)(2)(A).

<u>COUNT THREE</u> (Transfer of Obscene Material to Minors)

From on or about March 16, 2020 through on or about April 15, 2020, in Camden County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, the defendant,

FRANCISCO ANDRES MEDINA, a/k/a "Frank Nitty," a/k/a "Frank Mula,"

did use the internet, a facility and means of interstate and foreign commerce, to knowingly transfer obscene matter to Minor Victim 1, who had not attained the age of 16 years, knowing that Minor Victim 1 had not attained the age of 16 years.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1470.

FORFEITURE ALLEGATION AS TO COUNTS ONE AND TWO

The United States hereby gives notice that upon the conviction of the defendant FRANCISCO ANDRES MEDINA, a/k/a "Frank Nitty," a/k/a "Frank Mula," of the offenses in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2251, as charged in Count One of this Indictment, and in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252A, as charged in Count Two of this Indictment, the United States will seek forfeiture, in accordance with 18 U.S.C. § 2253, of all right, title and interest of the defendant in the following:

- (a) any visual depiction described in 18 U.S.C. §§ 2251, 2251A, 2252, 2252A, 2252B, or 2260, or any book, magazine, periodical, film, videotape, or other matter which contains any such visual depiction, which was produced, transported, mailed, shipped or received in violation of 18 U.S.C. Part I, Chapter 110;
- (b) any property, real or personal, constituting or traceable to gross
 profits or other proceeds obtained from the offenses charged in
 Counts One and Two of this Indictment, and all property traceable
 to such property; and
- (c) any property, real or personal, used or intended to be used to commit or to promote the commission of such offenses, and all property traceable to such property.

FORFEITURE ALLEGATION AS TO COUNT THREE

Upon conviction of the obscene material offense in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1470, as charged in Count Three of this Indictment, defendant FRANCISCO ANDRES MEDINA, a/k/a "Frank Nitty," a/k/a "Frank Mula," shall forfeit to the United States, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 1467(a), all of the defendant's right, title, and interest in (1) any obscene material produced, transported, mailed, shipped, or received in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1470; (2) any property, real or personal, constituting or traceable to gross profits or other proceeds obtained from such offense; and (3) any property, real or personal, used or intended to be used to commit or to promote the commission of such offense.

Substitute Assets Provision

If any of the above-described forfeitable property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- (a) cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- (b) has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person;
- (c) has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court;
- (d) has been substantially diminished in value; or
- (e) has been commingled with other property which cannot be subdivided without difficulty;

it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 853(p), as incorporated by 18 U.S.C. § 982(b), to seek forfeiture of any other property of said defendant up to the value of the above forfeitable property.
