I N F O R M A T I O N

The defendant having waived in open court prosecution by Indictment, the United States charges:

On or about July 26, 2025, in Burlington County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, the defendant,

MICHAEL PATRICK TAKACS, JR.,

did knowingly transport, in interstate commerce, an explosive with the knowledge and intent that it would be used to intimidate any individual and used unlawfully to damage and destroy any building, vehicle, and real and personal property.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 844(d).

FORFEITURE ALLEGATION

Upon conviction of the offense charged in this Information, the defendant,

MICHAEL PATRICK TAKACS, JR.,

shall forfeit to the United States: (1) pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 844(c) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461, any explosive materials involved or used or intended to be used in the commission of the offense charged in the Information; and (2) pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 982(a)(2)(B), any property constituting, or derived from, any proceeds the defendant obtained, directly or indirectly, as a result of such offense.

SUBSTITUTE ASSETS PROVISION
(Applicable to All Forfeiture Allegations)

If any of the forfeitable property described above, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- a) cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- b) has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third party;
- c) has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the court;
- d) has been substantially diminished in value; or
- e) has been commingled with other property which cannot be divided without difficulty,

the United States shall be entitled, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), as incorporated by Title 18, United States Code, Section 982(b) and Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c), to forfeit any other property of the defendant up to the value of the above-described forfeitable property.
