ATTACHMENT A

COUNT ONE

(Possession with Intent to Distribute Controlled Substances)

On or about June 10, 2026, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, the defendant,

ANDY NAZARIO,

did knowingly and intentionally possess with intent to distribute a quantity of a mixture and substance containing a detectable amount of cocaine, a Schedule II controlled substance.

In violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and (b)(1)(C).

ATTACHMENT B

I, Adam J. Rodriguez, am a Special Agent with the Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Investigations. I am fully familiar with the facts set forth herein based on my own investigation, my conversations with other law enforcement officers, and my review of reports, documents, and items of evidence. Because this Affidavit is being submitted for a limited purpose, I have not set forth each and every fact that I know concerning this investigation. Where the contents of documents and the actions and statements of others are reported herein, they are reported in substance and in part, except where otherwise indicated. Where I assert that an event took place on a particular date, I am asserting that it took place on or about the date alleged.

1. Since at least March 2026, law enforcement has been investigating Andy Nazario (“NAZARIO”) and others in and around Trenton, New Jersey, and elsewhere within the state for drug-related activities.

2. The investigation revealed that NAZARIO was supplying a quantity of cocaine for distribution in or around Trenton.

3. For example, on or about March 19, 2026, a confidential source (“the CS”) arranged to purchase cocaine from Individual-1. Individual-1 stated that he could provide the cocaine later that day. After a delay of many hours, when the CS inquired Individual-1 as to the delay, Individual-1 responded, in sum and substance, that the “big boss” in the “large truck” was responsible for bringing the cocaine to Trenton. Individual-1 sold the CS one kilogram of cocaine for \$17,000. The CS provided the \$17,000 to Individual-1 in a red bag (“the Red Bag”). After the drug transaction was completed, Individual-1, carrying the Red Bag, entered a Dodge Durango driven by another individual (“Individual-2”) and they drove away. Approximately 10 minutes later, Individual-2, driving the Durango, met up with NAZARIO, who was driving a large GMC truck (“the GMC truck”), in Trenton. Individual-2 entered the GMC truck for approximately one minute. Upon Individual-2’s exit from the GMC truck, NAZARIO drove away.

4. Law enforcement initiated a surveillance of the GMC truck and followed it back to NAZARIO’s residence in Passaic County, New Jersey (“NAZARIO’s Residence”). When NAZARIO exited the GMC truck and entered NAZARIO’s Residence, he was carrying the Red Bag.

5. On or about June 10, 2026, law enforcement executed a court-authorized search warrant for NAZARIO’s Residence in Passaic County. NAZARIO resides in the residence with his spouse. The residence contains a separate ground-floor apartment, which is utilized by an individual not part of this investigation. The remainder of the residence is occupied by NAZARIO and his spouse, which

includes a basement with a barber's chair and barbering equipment, two bedrooms, a living room, kitchen, and an attic.

6. When law enforcement approached the attic, it was locked. Upon gaining forcible entry, law enforcement recovered a quantity of cocaine, packaged in individual, vacuum-sealed bags, and a black softshell carrying case. A field test confirmed the substance to be cocaine. Also in the attic, were vacuum-sealing bags and a heat-sealing machine near the cocaine, items typically used to package cocaine. Law enforcement also recovered approximately \$20,000 of U.S. Currency bundled together with rubber bands in the attic.

7. One key to the attic lock was thereafter found on a keychain, which was located in a purse in the kitchen/dining room area. NAZARIO's wife identified the key as hers, and informed law enforcement that NAZARIO also had a key to the attic. NAZARIO has possession and control of NAZARIO's residence, including the attic. The account for the electric and gas utilities for the NAZARIO Residence are in NAZARIO's name.
