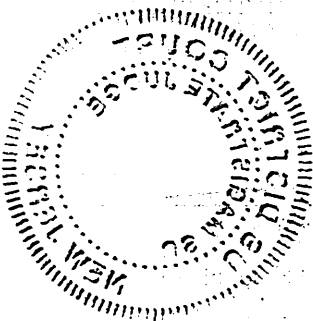

**Count 1
(Conspiracy to Distribute Child Pornography)**

On or about November 1, 2016, in Burlington County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, defendants

**CHRISTOPHER D. ROFFLER, and
BRIAN J. MCKAY**

did knowingly and intentionally conspire with each other to distribute material containing child pornography using a means or facility of interstate or foreign commerce, and that affected interstate or foreign commerce, by any means, including by computer, after having been previously convicted of offenses under Chapter 110 of Title 18 of the United States Code, namely the possession of child pornography, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252A(a)(5)(B) & (b)(2), and the distribution of child pornography, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252A(a)(2) & (b)(1).
