ATTACHMENT A

On or about March 3, 2017, in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, the defendant,

**TYSHONE T. OVERSTREET,
a/k/a "Tata,"**

having been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Essex County, did knowingly possess in and affecting commerce a firearm, namely a loaded .40 caliber handgun, bearing serial number NPR806.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g)(1).

ATTACHMENT B

I, Brian Manley, am a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I am fully familiar with the facts set forth herein based on my own investigation, my conversations with other law enforcement officers, and my review of reports, documents, and photographs of the evidence. Where statements of others are related herein, they are related in substance and part. Because this complaint is being submitted for a limited purpose, I have not set forth each and every fact that I know concerning this investigation. Where I assert that an event took place on a particular date, I am asserting that it took place on or about the date alleged.

1. On or about March 3, 2017, at approximately 4:30 p.m., law enforcement officers were conducting a proactive patrol near the border of Newark and Irvington in New Jersey, during which officers observed a white Jaguar sedan ("Vehicle 1") being driven with a cracked front windshield. As a result, the officers attempted to conduct a motor vehicle stop of Vehicle 1.

2. After activating the lights and sirens, law enforcement observed the rear passenger of Vehicle 1 turn around and look at the officers. Law enforcement recognized the individual as defendant Tyshone T. Overstreet, a/k/a "Tata" ("OVERSTREET"). Before Vehicle 1 came to a complete stop, OVERSTREET exited Vehicle 1 via the rear passenger door and fled on foot through the yard of a home.

3. As OVERSTREET was running away, law enforcement observed OVERSTREET reach into his waistband and throw a black object that appeared to be a firearm over a fence into the yard of another home ("Residence 1"). OVERSTREET then fled from the officers. Shortly thereafter, law enforcement searched the yard of Residence 1 and secured a .40 caliber Glock Model 22 handgun, bearing serial number NPR806 (the "Firearm"), along with an extended magazine and 17 rounds of live .40 caliber ammunition (the "ammunition") at the exact location where OVERSTREET had been observed throwing the black object.

4. The Firearm was test-fired by a law enforcement officer and determined to be operable and designed to expel a projectile by the action of an explosion.

5. The Firearm and ammunition were manufactured outside the State of New Jersey. Accordingly, the Firearm and ammunition necessarily had to travel in interstate commerce prior to OVERSTREET's possession of the Firearm and ammunition in New Jersey on or about March 3, 2017.

6. Before possessing the Firearm on March 3, 2017, specifically on or about July 29, 2016, OVERSTREET was convicted in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Essex County, of possession of a controlled dangerous substance or

analog, in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:35-10A, a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year.
