The United States Attorney charges:

Count 2

On or about November 23, 2016, in Bernalillo County, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, **DAVID A. HICKMAN**, maliciously damaged and destroyed, and attempted to damage and destroy, by means of fire, the Carlisle Condominiums complex, a building located at 3600 Central Avenue, S.E., which building was used in interstate commerce and in an activity affecting interstate commerce.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 844(i).

Count 3

On or about November 25, 2016, in Bernalillo County, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, **DAVID A. HICKMAN**, maliciously damaged and destroyed, and attempted to damage and destroy, by means of fire, the Starbucks Coffee shop, a building located at 5301 Gibson Boulevard in Albuquerque, New Mexico, which building was used in interstate commerce and in an activity affecting interstate commerce.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 844(i).

Count 4

On or about November 26, 2016, in Bernalillo County, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, **DAVID A. HICKMAN**, maliciously damaged and destroyed, and attempted to damage and destroy, by means of fire, the “Shred-it” business facility, a building located at 1415 Broadway Boulevard, N.E., in Albuquerque, New Mexico, which building was used in interstate commerce and in an activity affecting interstate commerce.

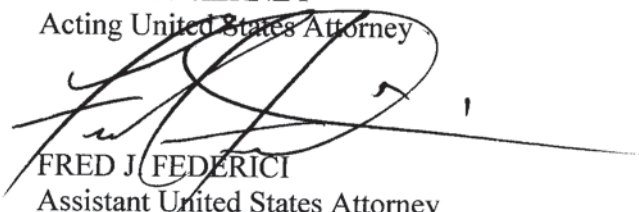
In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 844(i).

Count 5

On or about November 26, 2016, in Bernalillo County, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, **DAVID A. HICKMAN**, maliciously damaged and destroyed, and attempted to damage and destroy, by means of fire, the Barnes & Noble bookstore, a building located at 6600 Menaul Boulevard, N.E., in Albuquerque, New Mexico, which building was used in interstate commerce and in an activity affecting interstate commerce.
