

A CLEAR Summary

CLEAR Court participants are supervised by the U.S. Probation Office. The program is voluntary and Court sessions are held every other Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. To enter CLEAR Court, participants may not have active warrants and cannot have prior violent offense convictions. At least two years must remain on supervised release to be eligible for CLEAR Court. The rewards-based program (employment, counseling attendance and testing) offers opportunities to earn points toward incentives funded through the District of Nevada's, Attorney Admissions Fund. Participants can earn monetary rewards up to \$125 in gift cards to local retail stores and gas stations. Upon graduation, participants receive up to one year off the remaining supervised release term.

Upon successful completion of the program, society will have sober, law-abiding, employed individuals who engage in pro-social behaviors that include stable housing, financial responsibility and re-established family networks.
