THE GRAND JURY CHARGES:

General Allegations

1. Defendants #2 through #6 are identified as follows:

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2. On May 21, 2025, Defendants [1] – [8] were at the Gulf Gas Station at CWQW+4F5, Av. C. in San Juan, Puerto Rico, 00915 (GPS Coordinates: 18.437754, -66.053734) at approximately 1:00 p.m. – 2:00 p.m.
3. At that Gulf gas station, the Defendants were involved in a conspiracy with intent to distribute controlled substances, specifically cocaine.
4. Defendant [1] Bryan Martinez-Albizu provided the controlled substances (*i.e.*, the seller) and arrived at the Gulf gas station in a white Toyota Corolla.
5. Defendant [7] Santiago Nieves Hernandez and Defendant [8] Yoel Gomez Gomez were the brokers between Defendant [1] Bryan Martinez-Albizu and Defendants [2] – [6]: [2] FNU/LNU #1, [3] FNU / LNU #2 (a/k/a Richard), [4] FNU / LNU #3 (a/k/a Rochi), [5] FNU/LNU #4, and [6] FNU/LNU #5 (*i.e.*, the buyers).
6. At the Gulf gas station, controlled substances were exchanged for money between the seller, the brokers, and the buyers.

COUNT ONE

Conspiracy with Intent to Distribute Controlled Substances: Cocaine
(21 U.S.C. § 846)

The allegations contained in “General Allegations” are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth here.

From on or about May 20, 2025, and continuing to on or about May 24, 2025, in the District of Puerto Rico, the defendants,

[1] BRYAN MARTINEZ ALBIZU;
[2] FNU / LNU #1;
[3] FNU / LNU #2 (a/k/a Richard);
[4] FNU / LNU #3 (a/k/a Rochi);
[5] FNU/LNU #4;
[6] FNU/LNU #5;
[7] SANTIAGO NIEVES HERNANDEZ; and

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[8] YOEL GOMEZ GOMEZ,

knowingly and intentionally combined, conspired, confederated and agreed together and with each other, and with other persons known and unknown to the Grand Jury, to commit the following offense against the United States: possess with intent to distribute more than 500 grams of cocaine, a Schedule II controlled substance, in violation of 21 U.S.C. §§ 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(B)(ii)(II). All in violation of 21 U.S.C. § 846.

COUNT TWO

Kidnapping

(18 U.S.C. §§ 1201(a)(1) and 2)

The allegations contained in “General Allegations, 1a, 1b, 1c, 1d, and 1e” are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth here.

On or about May 21, 2025, in the District of Puerto Rico and within the jurisdiction of this Court, the defendants,

[3] FNU / LNU #2 (a/k/a Richard);
[4] FNU / LNU #3 (a/k/a Rochi);
[5] FNU/LNU #4; and
[6] FNU/LNU,

aiding and abetting each other and others, did unlawfully and willfully seize, confine, kidnap and abduct, and hold for ransom and otherwise, S.N.H. and Y.G.G. In committing or in furtherance of the commission of the kidnapping, the defendants used a means, facility, and instrumentality of

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interstate or foreign commerce, namely a Toyota RAV4, a Nissan SUV, and cellular telephones.

All in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 1201(a)(1) and 2.

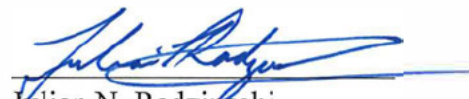
